

RIDES will leave promptly at the time designated on the trip schedule (see attached) --- suggest that you arrive 15 to 30 minutes early for unloading, adjusting equipment, etc. Any questions you might have regarding the rides should be directed to the trip chairman listed for that particular ride. Rides that must be cancelled due to rain will be rescheduled at a later date.

SAFETY is the individual rider's personal responsibility --- the ILLINOIS VALLEY WHEELMEN Club is not responsible for injury or accidents. Children must be accompanied by adults or arrangements must be made for adult supervision. Accidents can best be avoided by closely following all rules and regulations and by observing the laws that apply to automobiles: ride on the right, stop for traffic lights and stop signs, ride in single or double file (never more than two riders side by side). When there's traffic, don't turn left from the center of the street; pull off to the right and walk your bike across the intersection. Also walk across heavily traveled streets --- A FALL COULD BE FATAL!

Also, remember to wear light or bright clothing. BEING SEEN on the road is the most important key to survival!

 $\overline{\text{drink}}$  (water or soda) and an apple, orange, candy bar, etc. will be enough.

<u>SAG WAGONS</u> will be provided when a vehicle and driver are available — to carry tools, food, clothing and provide emergency service (bike repairs or a lift for weary riders).
