

REPORT FROM THE RACERS:

On April 17-18, Jay Manthey and Ted Snyder were at the Tour of Louisiana Stage Races: Opening Stage - Invididual Time Trial, Jay was riding Senior I-II and showed 54 seconds down on the National Road Champion, John Howard, which only gave him 33 place. In the following Road Stage, Jay's rear wheel loosened, due to bad roads. He received an immediate wheel change from the Campagnolo van. The gap to the field was too great and he finished, loosing ground at 12:30 in back of the pack. In the third Stage, Jay was consistently with the field until 20 miles to go, where he found himself in a break-away. He did not last and finished one minute down on the pack.

Ted held 12th place after the Time Trial, he did not finish the first Road Stage and did not start second Road Stage.

Tour of Garland (Texas) Stage Race April 23, 24, 25

First Stage: Ted raced Senior Men III-IV - 18 mile Road Race with time of 49:31 - 18th place (chain came off with five miles to go - he chased the pack to the finish) 1:30 down on pack.

Jay raced Senior Men II-III - 56 mile Road Race with time of 2:26:32 - 6th place - finished in pack.

Second Stage: Ted - 9 mile TT - time 25:35 - 14th place (move him up to 16th place overall)

Jay - 9 mile TT - time 23:33 - 5th place (move him up to 5th place overall)

Third Stage: Course was held in a Parking Lot around a football stadium with five 180° turns and two 90° turns - 1 mile course.

Ted - 10 mile crit. in 28:14 - 7th place (moved him up to 13th overall)

Jay - 20 mile crit. in 55:47 (including one wheel change) - 12th place (dropped to 6th place overall)

Ted's total time of 1:43:20 was 1:28 slower than 10th place finisher. His mechanical difficult in this Road Race set him back 1:30. If not for that he would have placed "in the money."

Jay's flat in the criterium stage and his running off the road into the ditch in the TT stage could have cost him several places, but there is no telling how much time this cost him. The Senior Men's II & III race was won by a junior rider who was not allowed to race Senior I.

USCF Races:

Carbondale Races held on April 10 and 11 saw the IVW Velo Racing Team show up with 6 racers.

Saturday April 10

Senior Class 3 & 4 - Ted Snyder placed 10th

Senior Class 4 & Veterans - Jay Manthey placed 8th

Senior 3 Class - Mark Williams finished in back in field.

Rich Miller, Steve Meismer & Rich White did not finish.

Sunday, April 11 (Carbondale) Threatened rain - turned out to be a nice day

Senior 3 Race - Jay Manthey sat in most of the race, and waited until the last lap to make his move on the hill. His tactics made this ride much more successful to win 2nd place. This placing moved Jay up out of the Senior 3's into Senior 2's (Good luck Jay, look out for the BIG boys). Ted Snyder placed just outside of the "money" in a strong showing of 7th place. Everyone else was unprepared for the hill.

May 2 - Burlington, Iowa - Crapo Park Criterium

Senior 4 - Ted Snyder - 5th Place; Jim Nelson DNF Senior 2 -3 - Jay Manthey - 4th Place; Mark Williams DNF; Steve Meismer DNF; Rich White DNF; Rich Miller DNF.

May 9 - Macomb, Illinois - 25 mile criterium - attended by 5 racers. Ted Snyder maintained an even speed after loosing the pack mid way through the race and captured 8th place with a little pain. Steve Meismer, Rich White, Jim Nelson, Joe Bacica - DNF. Jay Manthey did not race because Senior category I & II were excluded.
