

RIDE REPORT:

Fifteen cyclists rode with Don Eberle on his tour of the countryside north of Morton on May 9.

The best attended weekend ride of the past month (other than MPI) was Bob and Mike Small's Hanna City to Canton ride on May 16 with about 23 riders participating. The weather was perfect and the route was a real nice one with some really nice downhills. However, it was a day for tire problems, with at least three riders having flats.

The MORTON PEDAL-IN had 106 riders this year, with some from as far away as Richardson, Texas. Special note must be made about Phil and Ruby Frazier, who pedaled to the Pedal-In from Liberty, MO. They started on Sunday and arrived in our area on Friday. The Bloomington Club had good attendance. Riders also came from, Michigan, Cincinnati, Springfield, Joliet, DeKalb, Kansas City, Winfield, Davenport, Rock Island and other cities. Approximately 40 riders completed the 100 mile tour. The quickest time of approximately 6 hours was ridden by John Herleman from Kansas City, Missouri. The food was plentiful and good, sag coverage was good, and the route was well marked, rumor has it that someone got lost only for a little while. Overall the feedback and comments were all favorable, except for the wind. Items that were lost at the MPI were a saddle bag, rain suit, and a set of Ford keys. Contact G. Wind and the threat of rain kept attendance low for the Memorial Day weekend ride on May 30. The five riders, after getting a little wet while still in Pekin, took a quick break at the donut shop, and then decided to get at least a few miles in and rode to Tremont and back rather than

On Monday, May 31, Rich Miller, Roger Wise, Diane Ziegler and Craig Shanklin were in Crown Point, Indiana, for the annual "Dunes Century." Despite the fact that the first fifty miles were shrouded in fog and rain, that the route never came near the dunes, and that the organizers provided no food or rest stops, it proved to be an enjoyable trip for those who went. With talk of better organization next year, it could prove to be an even more rewarding ride through the localities pleasant countryside.

The joint ride with the Bloomington Club on June 6 came off very well though we had hoped for more riders from the IVW. Representation was about 50/50 with 9-10 riders from each club. The rolling terrain and warm morning made for a good workout. Bloomington club members will be invited to one of our rides later this summer.

After several weekends of rainy weather, Sunday, June 6, proved to be a beautiful day for Roger Wise, Diane Ziegler, Craig Shanklin and 300 other cyclists who were in Kenosha, Wisconsin, for the Kenosha Diamond Century. It was a very well organized ride (3 rest stops and a hot lunch) which had some beautiful views of Lake Michigan and the Lake Geneva area. The four hour drive and five toll booths were more than outweighed by the good time everyone had.

The Washington, Wednesday night rides have had as many as 12 riders. They have been riding mostly on the rural rodes just outside of town where there is little traffic. The distance has been kept below 10 miles. The Washington riders welcome everyone to join them at 6:30 P.M. on the Southeast corner of the Square.

The Peoria Wednesday night rides do exist at 6:30 P.M. at the McClure Library. (They seem to like cemetery routes)

MAY 22 Morton, Illinois

At least most of our own team showed up. A parked car on the course caused several unfortunate accidents in the early races, including a few of our own IVW racers. Luck with with us as all injuries were minor. Top placing went to Mike Cambron who took 4th place over Keenan Cluskey (5th) in the Junior event. Out of fourteen IVW racers in total the highest single placing went to Gerry Ireland in the Veterans race, in which he placed 2nd in a closely contested sprint. The Senior 2-3 race was very fast, and very aggressive. In fact it was so agressive, the Illinois State Representative refused to accept primes offered by some of the bystanders. NOTES:

In reference to training rides meeting at Kroger on Sterling, Peoria, we will ask everyone to follow a new standard of procedure.

- 1. Split into groups of 2, 3, 4, or 5.
- 2. Stay together with your group.
 - 3. Sprint only for designated landmarks.
 - 4. Regroup after sprints and hills.

This is requested so the riders can set their own pace; this is of great importance as our training schedules may dictate a different pace. We don't feel right slowing everyone down, or slowing down for a group of riders whose schedules conflict. Meet M, T, TH, F 5:30, at present.

Mark Williams will be leaving June 8 for Australia.
