1 tsp. cinnamon mix until smooth& creamy
1 tsp. nutmeg (store mixture in freezer)

to use: use 1-2 tblsp. mixture to 2-3 oz. dark rum - fill mug with hot water

Comments from the Coaches Couch:

Now that spring has arrived it is time to start thinking about getting the bike out and training.....

No that comment is not several months early to a bike racer "spring" is only a state of mind that should arrive early in January. If you are independently wealthy now is the time to go south. If you haven't left for the warm places yet what type of things can we do. After looking outside, my first thought is to build a snowman and put him on the bike. A better idea would be something like this, riding some on the weekends, 50 to 100 miles in two days, the exercises and indoor riding during the week. Two important things to remember when riding in the cold is to keep warm and do not push hard. Now is the time for long slow distance (LSD). Some of our clubs winter riding experts are Steve, Jay and Doug. If you need help in choosing clothes give them a call at 676-2011. You might also consider using a "fixed gear," track type, in the range of 70-75 inches. For exercises some of the areas you should consider working on are ankles, thoracic, spinal column, abdominal and back muscles, weight training (low weight, high repitition), also diaphram and breathing exercises.

To make getting into condition easier we will try doing it by sections. We will start with the section between the soles of the feet and the ears. If you want help with training, give me a call at 688-4799. I'll try to help anyone fram Catagory I racers to flower pickers.




