

Happiness is a constant journey, not a final destination.

This article is for all the shutter bugs like peggy, Ron, Harold, Rose etc, in the club in hope that they will continue to supply us with better pictures of the club's activities.

My first advice is to start with some good fast film for the action photos. Kodak Tri X (black and while) and high speed Ektachrome (color) are two popular films.

Most club members arrive before the starting time of the ride because they have preparations to make. They have to assemble their bikes, pump up tires, etc. These preparations give excellent photo possibilities and can be very amusing at times.

If you are going to take a portrait of the group try not to take it in the sunshine because your subjects not only will have to squint but the dark shadows will not make them look good.

The picture that will show all the riders and the overall scene is best taken at the start. There are a number of ways to do this but the clearest is to get a high enough vantage point to fill your photo with the whole group. Try to find something to stand or climb on - like the top of Les's Van. (He will not mind??)

Everybody wants an action photo of the group ride, so the easiest way is with a pan shot. It is picking out your riders in your viewfinder as they come down the road and clicking the shutter when they are opposite or perpendicular to you while continuing to swing the camera smoothly. You should practice that smooth swinging motion and clicking the shutter without hesitation.

My final suggestion comes from a bad experience of taking pictures along Lake Michigan. As Doug can testify, you do not get your camera wet if you want the film to develop.

PEORIA PARK DISTRICT'S
BICYCLE RODEO NEEDS IVW HELP!

Peoria Park District covers an area of approximately 50 square miles and has a resident population of about 142,000; with an estimated bicycle population of 106,500 or 75% of total.

One of Peoria Park Districts primary responsibilities is the development, implementation and evaluation of programs which affect the quality of its residents in a positive way. The Park Police of the Peoria Park District can deal directly with the problem of bicycle safety through the operation of a bicycle safety program which deals with education, enforcement, registration and evaluation in cooperation with the Peoria Public School system and city officials.

The Safety Laboratory Research Center provides instruction on basic safety rules and procedure to Peoria Public and neighboring School Districts. The program provides for a lecture-discussion, film and practical exercise on the outdoor safety course. Bicycle rodeos are used to reinforce enducational efforts taught during the school year.


Peoria Park District's '78 Summer Recreational

### HINT OF THE MONTH

A member found a really effective way to clean bike parts such a brakes and deraileurs. The home dishwasher does an outstanding job. Pay close attention! First wash any parts you are going to clean under very hot water. It will remove the worst of the dirt. Wipe off any dirt or soil that you can. Put the parts in the dishwasher through a normal cycle. They will turn out like new. Lubricate parts and install on bike. You might want to avoid putting greasy parts such as a chain into the dishwasher (unless it belongs to someone else). The IVW will not be reasponsible for any divorces or eviction notices if someone is caught using the above procedure in the home dishwasher. Also, do not clean parts in the same load as your fine china. Anonymous.

# THE GREAT BUDWEISER. RACING WEEK-END











The TT is held on the lakefront of Lake Ponchatrain with a starting field of 45 Sr. I & II. Jay shows a surprising 14th. Across Lake Ponchatrain on the longest bridge in the world (26 mi) in Covington, LA in a 60 mi. Road Race, Jay finishes in the pack sprint. The places don't change. Sunday on a longer version of the previous RR Ton Doughty (U.S. team member) gains almost 3 minutes on Jay and the pack. Jay finishes in 16th in general classification, 4th in the Sr. IIs.

April 1-2 / April Fools Stage Race, Houston, TX Jay's bike must like airlines, got lost again, but this time is found and returned much sooner. Ted Snyder is in good health, but feels he is not in shape to race. He does however, perform a great support effort for Jay. A starting field of 40 Sr. I & II. Jay places 8th in the TT, later in the say day, 7th in a 100 km RR. A 50 km criterium on Sunday sees Jay hang on to his 6th place overall time, 20 sec. behind Ralph Therrio.

April 5 / 9 Mile Time Trial - Grange & Trigger Steve Berger Cold and windy TT, looked 2 Steve Meismer like rain. Berger won it 3 Rich White even with a flat on way back.

RACERS - Please note the Training Race Schedule is in the Ride Schedule. Places in the Training Races will help determine where the sponsorship money goes and also will determine the points total for the Traveling Points Trophy given out at the Annual IVW Meeting in January.

April 9 / Will County Jay, Doug, Steve M., Sam J., and Ken Beckler went up to Will County which was everyones first race of the season except for Jay who has been flying all over the country. At 10:00 in the morning it was still cold and windy. In the Sr. I & II race Jay took off from the gun and it took the pack a lap and a half to catch him. Then it was everyone waiting to see what last years state road champ would do. On the last lap of the 45 mi. race the State Road Champ took off with another rider and the rest of the pack broke up into small groups with Jay finishing 5th and Doug 7th. \*\*\* \*\* Sr. III Steve M. started but didn't finish. 
