BUYING A USED BIKE

Since most cyclists come across used bicycles for sale I thought it would be helpful to discuss some things to look for in buying a used bicycle.

First carefully look at the lugs on the head tube for any noticeable hump. If any appear this simply means that the bicycle at sometime has suffered a headon collision. Not the perfect bicycle to buy or try to fix.

Another check to make is to look for a twisted head tube because it is a difficult job to bring a twisted frame back into line.

Look for weak spots that a fresh paint job may be hiding. A brand new paint job can be hiding a few bad nicks in the frame tubes, that have been filled with lead and filed.

Check for worn chainwheels, chain and the freewheel because a very common practice is to put on the bike that's going to be sold any well-used equipment the cyclist wants to get rid of from another bike.

After a good visual inspection to determine the condition of the bike, give the bike a short test ride to find if it handles smoothly. The next problem is finding the money for the bike.

Help is still needed for registration - please call after May 15th (will be out of town till then) or I'll call you!





MEMORIAL DAY TOUR - May 29, 1978


Planned for Memorial Day, Monday, May 29, is a real live old fashioned train/bicycle ride. The Rock Island "Rocket" departs at 6:45 A.M. from the Rock Island passenger station at the foot of Morton Street in Peoria. It will arrive in Bureau, Illinois, at 8:15 A.M. from where our bike ride following Rt. 26 back to Peoria will begin. The ride will be 60 miles in length. We will return around 2:00 P.M. Bring a lunch. Sag will be provided. CALL ME by May 24th if you are coming. We need an estimate on attendance as space may be limited. We will add some miles (probably) by returning via the Franklin Street bridge because of the condition of the McCluggage bridge. Thanks to Bob Wentz, Ticket Agent for the Rock Island Railroad who helped with arrangements. Ticket price is \$2.60. Please help by brining exact change. We will meet at the Rock Island station at 6:15 A.M. Bikes will go in the passenger car with their owner.

As this article goes to press a problem may have cropped up. The Rock Island has permission to discontinue passenger service from Peoria to Chicago at the end of May. I heard a news report just a short time ago and details were sketchy. The ride is still on! You will be one of the last people to ride the "Rocket," if you join us.
