THE CHOICE OF CHAMPIONS

FOLDING A CLINCHER TIRE: The procedure for folding a clincher caught my eye because on many centuries I have seen different riders with there clincher neatly tied in a small circle. So for all of you who want to look the part of the super tourist the following is a five step method for foling a clincher in a small circle.

(1) Fold tire cince in half, tire now forms a figure eight. (2) Fold one half inward, so that it meets the center of the first fold. (3) Draw the other loop in to match the two smaller loops you just made. (4) Draw these three loops together, equalizing them into one tight circle. (5). Bind the folded tire with tape. SM
