We need to counteract this by sending letters to the six board members of this committee and letting them know there is a great deal of interest and that we do need this trail. Over forty other area organizations besides the Sierra Club (IVW is one) have expressed support for the Rock Island Trail. We also need to let them know because Dr. David Kenney, Director of the Department of Conservation will be coming to the County Board meeting October 31, at 9:30 A.M. to discuss the trail.

Did you ever ride 100 miles just to get around a city? The Rockford September Century did just that. Starting on the Northeast corner, the ride took you completely in a circle of Rockford, but way out on the country roads surrounding the city. Traffic was virtually nonexistent, the roads were super and it was a good day to fly on your wheels! (I've been on 3 of Rockford's tours this year, the roads up there are excellent.)



You've never drank all the Apple Cider you would ever want until you have experienced the Apple Cider Century, put on by the Three Oaks Spokes Bicycle Club from Three Oaks, Michigan. This year over 1300 riders participated in the ride, which started off with breakfast served by the Three Oaks Fire Department at 5:30 in the morning for a small additional fee. The ride was two 50 mile loops, the second 50 miles for the 100 mile riders being the same as the first 50 miles for the half-century riders, which ending up with all the riders coming back into Three Oaks at approximately the same time. All the sags were equipped with barrels of cider and cookies and apples, the day was beautiful, the ride tookin some Northern Indiana farm lands and hills and dogs, to a sag stop at Warren Dunes Park on Lake Michigan. If you drive up on Saturday a favorite pre-ride tour is of Tabor Hill Winery for a tour of the winery and wine tasting and the purchase of a bottle or two for later consumption. This is a ride not to miss next year. The IVW has six riders up there and the distance from Peoria is not much farther than driving to Rockford, which seems closer, so don't let distance inhibit you, you won't regret it.


