IVW NOVEMBER MEETING MINUTES:

The meeting was called to order on November 30, 1978, at C.O.R.D. Bldg., Peoria, by President Ron Anderson. The Secretary's report was not given due to absence. The Treasurer, Steve Meismer reported a balance of \$223.59 and fifteen T-Shirts left to sell. The Racing Section reported that they will hold a meeting on December 2, at 5 p.m. with discussion of a Morton Sectional Classic, Mackinaw National Classic and Cyclo-cross races for the 1979 season. Jersey orders will also be discussed. Ride Chairman, Terry Beachler reported that rides are scheduled throughout January but February is open. Publicity Chairman brought to the attention of the club of the Journal Star report of the Cyclo-Cross race and Lou Luthans mention of the IVW on an article on him. Our May and August invitations tour dates have been set are were sent to the LAW Bulletin calendar, and also to the QCBC for inclusion in their tentative 1979 callendar. special announcement was made that Jack's Bicycle Shop was having a sellout; also, the Cross-Country ski club will hold a clinic on the Saturday of the First snow. The program by Chairman Cliff Brown was a film on the Colorado Bicycle Safety Program. Jack moved to adjourn and Terry seconded. Meeting was adjourned.

NEW YEARS DAY RIDE:

The New Years Day Ride will start at Jerry Selvo's house, 1519 N.E. Monroe Street, Peoria. If you are downtown turn NE on Monroe Street and go past the Spring St. stoplight and if you get to Woodruff High School you have gone a couple blocks too far so turn around and come back a few blocks. The ride will start at 1 p.m. and, depending on the weather and temperature will be relatively short, possible Peoria Courthouse, downtown, and back again. Upon return to Jerry's house, we plan a small get-together. So if you plan on coming bring not only your bicycle, but your favorite goodies, hot drinks will be available.

This has been an annual event for the IVW for some time and has been an excellent winter activity for the IVW for the past few years. 
