

IVW RIDE REPORTS:

- July 29--Diane Ziegler led 16 riders from Chillicothe to Princeton for a 90-mile trek on a hot, sunny day. Roads were reported as excellent.
- Aug. 11-12-Don Eberle led three others from Morton to Mahomet via Lake of the Woods Park and Tin Cup Campers Park. Very light traffic reported on U.S. 150 to near Danviers on Sunday morning. The group rode 182 miles round trip. See report below.
- Aug. 12--Jack Allen was leader from Mossville to Henry, Lacon, Sparland, and return. Seven riders made the 70-mile trip.
- Aug. 19--IVW Metric Century. Good, hot weather and 55 riders. The financial results are not yet available. Good cooperation and assistance from IVW members.
- Aug. 26--Gary Sams led a group of ten from Pekin Insurance Building to Tremont and return.

 Gary even marked the route, and reported that over 60% of the riders cycled to the 17-mile event.
- Sept. 2--The annual Chicken Ride was from Peoria Courthouse to Chillicothe via Mossville School. Fifteen riders, led by Don Eberle, started from Peoria and were joined by 16 others at Mossville. Riders ate at Chillicothe. Some then split to ride to Princeville; others rode back to Mossville or Peoria. Pam Anderson brought the IVW trailer to Mossville to pick up riders wanting a lift back to Peoria. Ride covered 28 miles ending at Mossville. Several youngsters, a couple on 20-inch bikes, made the shorter leg of the trip. Don did an excellent job as leader.
- Sept. 7--The Moonlight Ride, Eureka to Goodfield and return, was held in perfect 50° windless weather, under a brilliant moon. Carol Stiles led six others starting at 10 p.m.
- June 9 & 10 from Morton to New Salem State Park
 Seven riders started this ride on a sunny day with a moderate, southwest wind. We
 picked up two more riders in San Jose; they quit in Middletown. That night we ate in
 the lodge and walked through the village. It rained before we got back to the camp
 area. Next morning it was cool and very cloudy with 40 mile winds out of the
 northwest. Two riders called home for transportation. John Yeck stayed in the lodge,
 and I have not seen or heard from him since. From Middletown north we had this
 head wind all the way home. We lost another rider at San Jose. He called in for a
 ride home. Three of us rode all the way. We all learned a lot on this ride. It
 could have been worse if it would have rained. This was a very demanding ride.
- August 11 & 12 from Morton to Lake of the Woods, Mahomet, Illinois

 This ride was 90 miles each way. Four riders left on this ride after a slight delay. Rick forgot his front wheel, so he had to get one. It was a nice, warm day with slight northeast wind 10-15 m.p.h. We ate supper in town before going to the camp ground. The shower required a quarter for hot water. It was jacket weather that night. The wind held so we rode U.S. 150 back to Bloomington, then we went through Mackinaw. We had lunch at Steak & Shake in Bloomington. The service there left something to be desired. This was a super ride. It had good roads and lots of food.
