I was alerted to proposed changes in the Illinois Vehicle Code in a letter from the Mt. Prospect Bicycle Club. Some of the proposals are very good, the bicycle is defined as a vehicle, position on the road is clarified, riding two-abreast is legal under certain situations. However it continues to include a mandatory bike path section, and introduces an alternate way to legally make left turns. I believe the left-turn rule will complicate things and cause accidents. 



RIDE REPORT & COMMENTS: Do you want to hear about the best place around to have breakfast on a Sunday morning? Well, I'll tell you about it anyway. Delavan, Illinois, American Legion serves breakfast every Sunday morning. can get two huge pancakes the size of your plate, two fresh eggs, your choice of breakfast meat, and all the coffee you can drink for a nominal fee. What does this have to do with bicycling? Everything. This was the destination of seven hearty IVW bicyclists who left from the corner of Rt. 98 and the Groveland blacktop on Sunday morning at 7:00 a.m. on March I5, I98I. As we continued to ride South, the Southwest wind gradually began to blow a little harder. By the time we arrived in Delavan, I6.8 miles later, we were all ready for the biggest breakfast the American Legion served. It was so good. However, I know I for one ate too much and was reluctant to jump on my bike and ride home. However, except for approximately 3 miles, that headwind that we rode into on the way down was a super tailwind coming home. The total mileage for the excursion was 4I miles, average miles per hour (including the time spent eating) was 9 mph. How do I know of these statistics? Les Siegrist is now riding with a Pacer 2000 on his bike. You may have seen this advertised in the bicycling magazines. It is an electronic device that calculates all sorts of goody statistics that are really fun to know. \*\*\* Let me tell you another thing about why this trip was special to me. I started riding a bicycle in 1975. is when I joined the IVW, the fall of 1975. My first ride with the IVW riders was one which started in Tremont, Illinois. The people who rode on that ride were Les Siegrist, Don Eberle, Bill Perry, Jack Welch and a few more. The riders on the Sunday morning breakfast ride were the four guys mentioned above plus Jim Roberts and Bob Jones (they both have joined the IVW after I was already riding). It is such a good feeling to ride with the same people year after year; those people really love riding as much as I do. That, to me, is what the Illinois Valley Wheelmen is all about. A forum for people who like to ride to be able to get together and do just that ... ride their bicycles. Each year we pick up some new people who also like to ride, the comradery is something that I treasure. It was good to see all my old riding companions again after the long winter and to all you new members I can't wait to welcome you to our roads. Diane Ziegler
