*ON THE ROAD" by the Blue Streak Once you have enough confidence in your bicycling skills, you can easily mix with other vehicle traffic. Be assertive but neither aggressive or timid. Use the traffic lanes at intersections in the same manner as any other vehicle. If you're going straight, stay out of the right-side turn lane, don't rest your foot on a convenient curb, and give right turning traffic the opportunity to turn behind and to your right.



RIDE REPORT: The tour of the Scioto River Valley is the ultimate century ride in the country. The 20th annual ride started May 9th from Coulumbus Ohio south to Portsmouth Ohio and back to Columbus on Sunday May 10th. There were over 3,500 bikers this year from 38 states and Canada taking part in the annual event. TOSRV cost the Columbus Council of American Youth Hostels about \$76,000 and 400 volunteers to sponsor the event. The money comes from donations and from a \$20.00 registration fee. The route goes through circleville, Chillicothe and Waverly on Ohio Route IO4 to Portsmouth. Saturday we started our the Ist IIO miles of the tour by 6:30 a.m. and enjoyed a nice day of riding with 3 food stops except for about 30 minutes of light rain. After we arrived in Portsmouth Saturday afternoon we enjoyed a home cooked chicken dinner with fellow bikers and a much needed night sleep. Sunday we had a Southern breadfast of biscuits with sausage gravy and grits at a local restaurant. Then back on our bikes for the IOO mile return trip to Columbus. All types of people ride these tours young, old, experienced, inexperienced, singles, families and also some unusual hikes were recumbents, a very tall 30 inch frame bike and a bike called a triple which is similar to a tandem but it has 3 seats and 3 sets of pedals. Attending this years TOSRV was Ron Matuska, Steve Meismer, Jim Roberts, the Bergers, Diane Ziegler, Terry Jones, and Rod Myers. To apply for the 1982 tour just write to TOSRV Communications P.O. 
