You will be able to make choices about your own personal involvement in the sport of bicycling much more intelligently with the broad background that the League provides. The League will keep you up to date about what's going on in the world of bcycling. And you'll be kept abreast of legislative developments that will affect you and bicycling." DRAFTING PRECAUTIONS: I love to draft, to ride right behind a fellow cyclist and get the benefit of the partial vacuum he creates as he cuts through the wind. The only thing better is to ride behind a line of cyclists, the so-called pace line. But it is dangerous business, and anyone who indulges in the practice ought to be aware of that. In a good pace line, a cyclist at tops might be a half foot behind the rider in front. If he is travelling I5 mph, he is moving 22 feet, or 44 times the distance between his bicycle and the frontrunner's each second. The point is obvious: If the rider in front of you slams on his brakes without your knowing about it, you're going to crash into him, no matter how good a cyclist you are, no matter how fast your reflexes. So what do you do? If you decide to draft, decide to ride a pace line, you make sure everyone involved-the front rider, the last rider, everyone-knows what you all are doing. You never ride directly behind a cyclist without telling him you're there. Ane once you've done that, you talk. A pace line of good riders is a gazgle sound. They shout out when the're slowing down, shout out when they're swinging left to avoind a pothole, shout out when they're switching gears. They even let the people behind know if they're reaching for their water bottle since even that small action will affect the pace of the entire line. Dick Benfield LAW


State Road Race June 14 cont.
