

BICYCLE DEATH A bicyclist (not a member) was recently killed in Morton while riding on the wrong side of the street. Many people (evidently including the police dispatcher) still view the left side of the street as the safer route. Although our members know that the right side is the safer, legal and only allowable path, the public apparently is in need of some type of education better than that now available to it. Even on some Saturday morning club rides, I have noticed a tendency for riders to practically straddle the center line when facing oncoming traffic. Our appearance in public is important to the way the car-driving public views bicycling. Our first concern for any ride should be safety. Only when we ride in a safe manner can we begin to complain about the bicyclist's second-class road citizenship. The winter is an excellent time for the club and its members to review ride procedures with an eye to safety. I would appreciate some response on this subject from members and the public.
