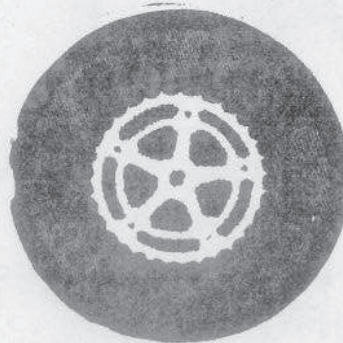

President's notes The IVW, being an affiliated club of the League of American Wheelmen, had several of its members attending the National Convention at Dayton, OH. on July 1 - 5. I had no takers for the trip over, so I did the 350 miles alone. The tour was uneventful and took $3\frac{1}{2}$ days. The convention had 898 registrants and a considerable number of rides and workshops to keep us busy the entire four full days. The activities were centered at the University of Dayton and the Annual Meeting was held at the Marriott Hotel close by. With about 15 rides and 25 workshops schedules each day, it became a tough job deciding on one's best use of time. We attended three hours of workshops given by Bill McCreedy of Santana Cycles (tandems), the Legal Considerations workshop and plenty of rides. Many comments were made about the absence of road marking but the maps were excellent. Most significant to your pres. and also to the IVW is that much concern and discussion was involved with our current litigation. While support was not unanimous and the expense of a proper defense may be prohibitive it was certainly encouraging to be able to meet constructively with our new Regional Director, Fred Kennerly of Rockford and Joe Tobias of the Wheeling club. The strongest bit of advice recieved was to separate the touring and racing clubs. Believe me, your Executive Committee will be discussing this subject and you will hear our proposal for a constitutional change. -- John Wellwood

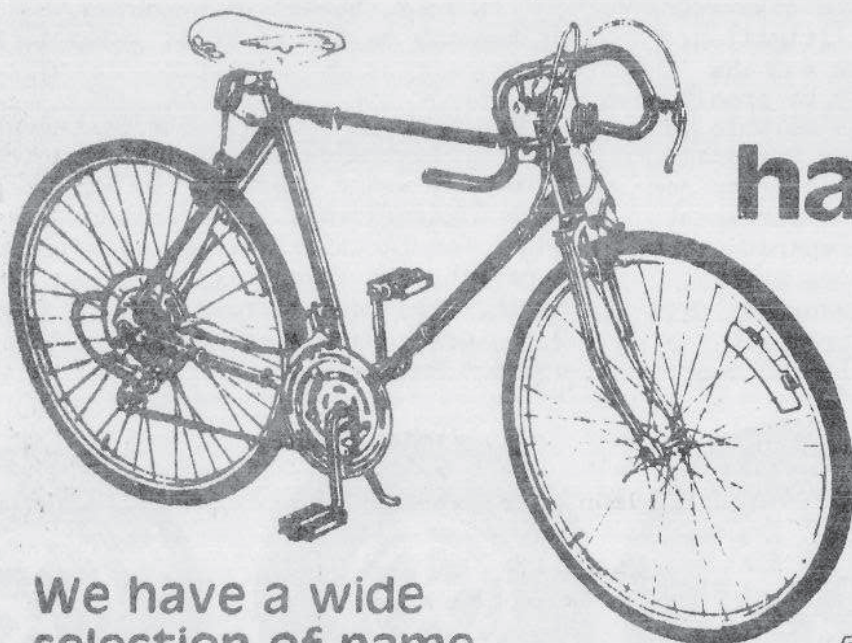


