




Ever had a tire that wouldn't pop up on the rim evenly when you inflate it? This generally happens with cheaper tires. To solve this; deflate the tire, pinch the tire away from the rim, spray WD-40 on the tire bead in the areas where the tire won't seat right, in flate tire, repaet several times. If this woesn't work, use a tire seating tool or take it to a shop that has one. (Make sure you keep the WD-40 off the putside of the rim).

My clock rings at 6:30 a.m. and I jump out of bed, put on my riding clothes, carefully fold my dress and place it every so gently in my packs, reset the odometer on my bike and out the door I go. My route takes me down Rt. 29 North of Peoria, with the grates and traffic and potholes to keeping me alert. The birds are chirping over the sound of the traffic, the sun is glowing over the river flowing under the bridge. My turns are all carefully signaled, my clothing bright so traffic has no trouble seeing me. In my rearveiw mirror I can see the big trucks and little economy cars pull out into the other lane and drive around me. Once in town I ride up a block to Madison St., I can relax a bit, there ususally is no traffic here, until I have to drop down and ride back on Jefferson St. around the bus garage, then I turn up Abington to Monroe (I have to be careful about the Woodruff H.S. traffic, those kids never watch where they are going). The ride down Monroe Street to downtown is easy now with the stoplight on Spring Street. I take Monroe all the way to Hamilton and turn toward the river. Now that I am downtown, it's kind of fun to ride along with the traffic to Washington Street, then the trick is to ride between the Caterpillar people crossing the street, "excuse me folks, please let me through before the cars come." gear down a little in advance before I enter the parking deck and making sure no cars are going to run me over on the up ramps and I ride to the second level of the parking deck and lock my bike with my Kryptonite U-Bolt lock to the guard railing along the ramps, out of the way of all the parked cars. I then remove my packs, water bottle and pump from the bike (I don't trust the Peoria theives). I then go into the building, downstairs to the fitness center and shower and dress for work. After the day's end, I jump back into my riding clothes, unlock the bike, pack it up and cruise home on the same route I came to work on. Commuting to work brightens my day on the way in and relieves me of all the afterwork tension on the way home. just love it!


