


NOVICE RIDES IN THE "BIG CITY".....

Please note the differing times of these rides. For a more enjoyable ride you should be an experienced rider, able to repair and maintain your own bike during the ride. No sag is provided.			



#### Let the good times roll — again

It's time for PACRACC '83 — 230 miles of bicycling around Central Illinois. This is the second year of the Pantagraph Area Cyclist Ride Around Corn Country, and the ride is even better than last year's event. It features more miles, more hills, more food, more fun and more people. Join in this Labor Day weekend for the biking and basking in the sun, the camping and the comradery of PACRACC '83. And have a safe and leisurely ride.



- Registration fee is \$25 before Aug. 22, then \$30. Early registration will greatly assist in planning.
- Entry fee includes: PACRACC packet, maps, well-marked route, PACRACC patch, sag service, baggage transport, two suppers, two breakfasts and camping. Additional meals and snacks may be purchased from cooperating civic organizations. Many rest stops have been planned for your convenience.
- Entry forms available. Send a self-addressed, stamped business envelope to PACRACC, The Pantagraph, 301 W. Washington St., Bloomington, IL 61701. Such an envelope must accompany all completed entries to assure a return confirmation, directions and motel/camping information.
- Start and finish of the biking/camping tour will be at Paul F. Beich (say "Bike's") Candy Co. on the southwest edge of Bloomington.
- Registration check-in between 7 and 9 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 3. All cyclists should begin each day before 9 a.m. (All riders must be off the route by 7:30 p.m.)

Racing News:




The car, described as a brown Cougar, left the scene.




