

Bloomington, Indiana

Bicycling is best in Southern Indiana when the fall colors are the prettiest. Around 2,000 bicyclists ride the two 50 mile loops in and out of Monroe and Brown Counties. On Saturday you are fed a hot chicken dinner en route at Brown County Park with blue grass music for your ears and then you run the roller coaster hills back to Bloomington. Sunday's ride takes you by the Llama and big horned sheep farm set on the hillside before you arrive in Nashville, Ind. While in Nashville take some time to have some spicy hot coffee or expresso in the little cafe nestled under the trees and then meander down the street to the candy shop and taste their confections (they have free samples set out). Or, you can eat fish sandwiches at the town square as the autumn leaves fall around you and then buy a cookie or two from the bake sales set up on the lawn. After lunch you climb a few hills through BeanBlossom, ride by Lake Lemon and workyour way home to Bloomington. This is the perfect ride to finish the riding season.


