
Lon Haldeman rode his the fastest. Diane Ziegler did one a couple years ago. Thomas Stevens was the FIRST. On April 22, 1884, Stevens left Oakland California to record the first transcontinental bike ride. His highwheeler was pushed, shoved, & even at times ridden over 3000 miles & $103\frac{1}{2}$ days. To celebrate the ride, Martin Potts of Washington, Il., along with several other antique bicycle enthusiasts, will mount his own highwheeled bicycle & ride nearly the same route as the pioneer pedaler... except for the welcomed addition of paved roads. None of the later group has yet announced plans to further emmulate Stevens by continuing to trace his journey around the world.
