Mo Siegel, president of the Celestial Tea Company and founder of the race has seen it grow to an International event with a budget of over \$450,000.


This year there were 92 men from 12 countries & 3 teams from the USA, and 41 women from 10 countries and 3 USA teams.

In 1980 it became the Coors Classic and it has just grown in leaps and bounds, with a staff of 100 paid persons and 400 volunteers.

10th Annual Coors International Bicycle Classic... Colorado

After reading my May issue of Bicycling magazine I was sure we had made the best choice for a vacation in the Colorado Rockies, during the "Coors Classic".

We spent a week in Vail and I got to witness the Womens Vail Criterium (40km) and the mens Criterium (80km). The womens race was won by Connie Carpenter of Boulder who just 2 weeks later won a GOLD MEDAL in the Olympics. Italian, Emilio Ravasio beat out Thurlow Rogers of the Levi-Raleigh USA team and third place went to Jeff Pierce riding for American Savings USA.

HTERNATIONAL BICYCLE CLASSIC

Steve Bauer(Canada) took a \$1400 field sprint about half way through the race. The woman's road race, which went 15 miles up the mountain and 15 miles down(60 mph across cattle gates), was won by 7-11 team member Peggy Maass(USA).

We stayed in a ski lodge with the Canadian woman's team and coaches. They were very nice & fast riders. They were interested in riding in Illinois.

The Denver (Washington Park) Criteriums drew large crowds. Connie Carpenter(Levi-Raleigh-USA) took the win followed by Jeannie Longo (France). Davis Phinney(7-11 USA) came from the back to take the pack sprint from Steve Bauer.

An even larger crowd watched the festivities at North Park in Boulder even though the USA's biggest names(Phinney, Twigg, & Carpenter) were already headed for the olympics & didn't race. A huge tent full of all types of bicycles and related gear was on display & provided some great browsing & shopping for the fans on hand.

Eddy Mercx & John Howard (Ironman Triathalon winner) were also on hand to sign autographs.

The Woman's Road Race was won by Sue Novara-Reber (Levi-Raleigh)USA, who then announced her retirement from racing. Steve Bauer won the men's Criterium on a day which reminded me of Peoria(90°with 90% humidity). In all ,it was great to see the comradery of the olympic athletics & the Great Spirit of the crowds(many of whom weren't really bikies).

The big sponsors did a great job of providing news coverage & the race seems to grow better every year.
