P-Z desserts


Bring the second course according to the first inital in your last name. Joe Russell's Cycle World has graciously offered to provide FREE beer and the club will provide table service & condiments.

Northern Oaks Club House is the SAME place the banguet was held last year, if you remember it is easy to find......



#### Peorian places in cycle nationals

Peorian John Wellwood placed among the top 10 bicyclists in two categories at the Veterans National Championships at Denver, Colo. Wellwood was seventh in the 40-mile road race for ages 55 and older (time: 2 hours, 2 minutes, 41 seconds) and was eighth in the 25-mile time trial for the 55-59 age group (1:03.20).

## Touring

The sun was putting a little light in the sky and with our stomachs full, via Hardees. We started down Sterling Ave. for Decatur to visit my brother. Jim Kelly and his daughter, Fran and myself were into the first-half of back-to-back Centuries.

We passed through such cities(villages) as Minier, Atlanta(II.), McLean, Waynesville, Hallsville and Kenny. Now I'm talking small towns... We had just perfect weather Saturday the 28th and Sunday the 29th also. I had driven the route last year so I knew it was a scenic road. After a good lunch along with a large glass of orange juice and half--hour rest under a shade tree we were back on the road. The stomach pain was getting better now and I was no longer feeling weak, the speed was building up again and soon we were bussing down the road as before.

It did take one hour longer on the return trip, but We did it. I sure felt like this was an accomplishment for ME. Back to back Centuries, why just last May,83 I couldn't even make 100 miles in one day. Maybe next year it will be the RAGBRI or even a Transcontinental..... Who knows.

Remember we all must go at our own pace and we should ENJOY that pace before we try for a faster pace, one step at a time....

REPORT FROM THE SECOND CONSTITUTIONAL COMMITTEE

A Committee was formed to study the IWW Constitution and By-Iaws and determine if it still meets the club's needs. Ron Anderson, Greg Benning, June Cowan, Rolla Godfrey, Jim Kelly and Ron Matuska served on that committee. The Committee concluded that some revisions were in order. These changes are included in the PRO-POSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSITUTION AND BY-JAWS annexed to this newsletter. The reasoning behind these changes are as follows:

1. CONTINUITY - The Directors will be serving two year terms and their experience will be carried over from year to year with five new directors with fresh ideas coming in each year.

 TEN NEMBER BOARD - This number will insure there are enough people to share the rany duties involved in running the IVW; also it will better represent a cross-section of

the membership.

3. MEMBERSHIP PARTICIPATION - It may be easier for members, especially new members, to contribute to the club programs. Cetting members to commit themselves to a specific office for a long time resulted in few willing to take on the responsibility and "burn out" for those who did.

4. IONG-RANCE PLANNING - A Board of Directors will be better able to plan club activities over an extended period of time (i.e., reserving the meeting room from year to year on the fourth Thursday, ensuring the Pedal-In planning committee keeps running from year to year without break and, most importantly, seeing that the rides keep getting scheduled).

This proposal will be further discussed at the October meeting. Action on the proposal, along with elections, will take place at the annual meeting in November.


