

SAFE RIDING: I've noticed that safety is becoming more important for the group. Why? Not just because it's smart-that is too mundane a reason. By riding single file in town (and no more than double out of town) and by pulling off the road completely at stops, members are rediscovering that organized group cycling is an enjoyable method of reaching B from A. Kudos to all rideleaders!!!!

MEETINGS: The numbers of members turning out for the meetings speak for themselves. I believe I counted 50 people at the March and April meetings. Many thanks to Suzie Woodward for keeping up the lemonade wagon.



TIME TRIALS

If you can ride a bicycle ten miles, you can do a time trial. Here are a few suggestions to improve your speed.

1) Limber up the back by doing daily stretching exercises. The idea is to become comfortable on the drops of the handlebars. A back parallel to the ground is more aerodynamic than the latest aero parts. 2) Show up early enough to pedal 2 or 3 miles at a moderate pace. Warm up the legs. Make sure to get enough sleep and eat a very light breakfast. 3) Remove extraneous equipment: bags, water bottles, pump, etc. All these items contribute to wind resistance. 4) Work toward a positive mental attitude. Improve your time, don't ride against other rider's times. Everyone should win in the time trial.

Time Trials take place most Saturdays (check the ride schedule). Location is Old Galena Road just north of Cedar Hills Drive (north of Mosssville). at 7:00 A.M. Please park in the parking lot and not on the road. Remember: TT's are an individual effort—no drafting or pack riding.






