

ROUTE:

Lake Camelot to Canton Lake. The route will travel on hilly southwestern Peoria County roads. Back at Lake Camelot enjoy a cool swim in the lake, a delicious picnic luftch, and shower before heading home

FEE:

Preregistration until August 15 - \$6.00 After August 15 and day of ride - \$7.50

DETAILS:

The fee includes marked route, map, several snack stops, commemorative ride patch. LAW sanctioned metric century patch available for purchase) sag wagon, picnic and swimming (bring your swimsuit and a towel, showers also available).

DIRECTIONS: Take the Airport Road exit from I-474, turn left on Airport Road. TO LAKE Airport Road becomes Garfield Ave. At the High School stop sign turn right and follow this road approximately 4 miles (Garfield CAMELOT turns into Lancaster Road). You will go down and up two big hills. At the top of the second hill is the entrance to Lake Camelot. Follow the entrance road over the dam and up the hill to the Clubhouse. (Alternate Directions - follow IVW signs from I-474 exit.)

PRESIDENT'S NOTES:

THE ARROGANCE OF IGNORANCE, PART ONE : Walked into my favorite running shoe store the other day to pick up a new pair of tennies. After having made my purchase and inquired about a stopwatch for our Saturday morning time trials, began talking to another clerk. He grabbed a piece of paper and started to draw a sketch for a super long pedal which would give a running shoe (which was velcroed to the pedal)the requisite stiffness of a cycling shoe. The idea was to eliminate the need for a cycling shoe in triathalons, because most people feel more comfortable in running shoes and wouldn't feel trapped in running shoes." Although the clerk could pick out the exactly correct running for a given activity, he could not imagine that cycling shoes chould be as technical or necessary.

THE ARROGANCE OF IGNORANCE, PART TWO : The Wall Street Journal ran a brief article on bicycle sales on May 16th The Journal may know business, but when it comes to bicycles, it's walking up The Journal reports that most hills. "imports are expected to capture a bigger share (about 45% against 42% last year) of the U.S. market." Of course, its source for the information seems to be the Bicycle Manufacturers Assoc. (the group which is pushing hard for import quotas to "protect" Huffy's, Murray's, and other department store bicycles) . What, after all, are imported bikes when nearly the only part of a Huffy that is American is the frame? When partisan sources become the Journal's bean counters, the end result is more bad information for a public that by and large uses no other information sources.

NEWSPAPERS: The Peoria Journal Star is a favorite subject to kick for many of my friends, but I really believe that it's a sharp outfit. However, it does screw up once in a while. Recently, in a "Hotline" column, a reader asked about traffic lights that sense metal in order to control traffic. This reader's small motorcycle could not flip the lights because it was not big enough.

One of the Star's suggestions was to change the route he travels in order to avoid this type of intersection!! The Star then stated City Traffic Engineer Jim Baumann says there are about 60 intersections like this in the city. Just riding home from work, I hit 3 to 5 of these intersections. Why do bicyclists have to put up with poor intersections design? Whoever designed these traffic signals is probably well-off by now, educated, and maybe even a nice guy. But he doesn't ride a bicycle and he is not helping cyclists by his ignorance . PJS does mention that if you have difficulty at a particular intersection, to call Baumann's office at 672-8570 to discuss this problem.

LOOKING FOR A GOOD RIDE? Get out to the Wednesday night rides (in Pekin, Peoria, or Washington). We had nearly 30 people at a recent Peoria ride. After the ride we pulled the tables together at Avanti's on Sterling (as we always do) and ate spaghetti and traded lies. Great times! MOSSVILLE 10 MILE TIME TRIALS

No time trials were scheduled for the 8th or 15th of June. This was due to many other events on the 8th(state time trials, Galesburg Races Litchfield, Ride to the Rock,etc.) and the Pedal In on the 15th. More news and results on the Pedal In in next month's newsletter. Time Trials resume on the 22nd of June. They start just north of Ceadar Hills Drive on Old Galena Road at 7 A.M. on Saturday's. They are an individual effort against the clock; no pack riding or drafting. The course record is held by Daryl Johnson. With 70 degrees and 95% humidity and no wind, Daryl pedaled to a time of 22:48 on August 4, 1984. You don't have to be Superman to time trial; just take a lively interest in your own cycling performance and join the IVW in the battle against the clock. Our novice riders are being observed for improvement that could lead to the "most improved rider" award that is given at the annual meeting in November.
