ILLINOIS VALLEY WHEELMEN SUMMER METRIC CENTURY BICYCLE RIDE
The Illinois Valley Wheelmen Bicycle Club presents the SUMMER METRIC
CENTURY Bicycle ride to be held on Sunday, August 18,1985, starting at
Lake Camelot Clubhouse. The ride will consist of a Metric Century (62)
and a Half-Century (30) mile route. The longer route will have riders
completing a loop to Canton Lake. A registration fee of \$6.00 (prereg)
and \$7.50 (day of) will be charged. The services provided will be a
completely marked route, sag wagon, maps, food stops en route, patch,
and a picnic and swimming back at Lake Camelot after the ride. Registration opens at 7:00 AM and continues until 9:00 AM. Riders under 18
years of age need a signature of a parent or guardian to participate.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES-METRIC

There will be one 62 mile route to Lake Canton with 3 rest stops.

A 30 mile route will cut off the longer route and will include 2 stops

Riders are encouraged to abide strictly by the rules of the road and proper riding etiquette. Helmets are suggested.

Riders are encouraged to have their bicycles in proper working order.

Sag service will be provided to riders with mechanical problems only if needed.

Water will be available at the rest stops, and on the sag wagon, but we stress that you also carry your own water bottles.

The route is hilly so riders are encouraged to have low gears on their bikes.

Inexperienced and novice riders should be comfortable riding a ride of this type due to the number of stops and sag service.

At Lake Camelot you will find: showers, a picnic and cold refreshments, swimming (with a lifeguard).

Come to the SUMMER METRIC CENTURY, it promises to be a good bicycling experience.



BICYCLE HISTORY, Sam Joslin

An important centenary is celebrated this year with the anniversary of the Rover Safety Bicycles introduced by the Englishman, J.K. Starley. The Rover certainly wasn't the first bicycle, but with its modern diamond frame (sans seat tube) and equal size wheels, it announced the end of the high wheeled bicycle. Along with the Bush-Roller Chain developed in 1880 and the pneumatic tire popularized by Dunlop in 1888, the Starley Rover opened up bicycling as a sport of the masses. Before Rover, only the Brave (and wealthy) straddled the "ordinaries" and peddaled over the sub-standard roads of the day.

In America, the good roads movement bloomed, and, because of the free-dom of movement and the demands of sensible cycling clothing, women's independence advanced. Unfortunately, automobiles were soon introduced and bicycles were relegated to the shed and women to the kitchen

Celebrate 100 years of cycling on the "safety" with a ride today! And remember that Bill Semmens has been working hard to schedule the rides you want. Have a suggestion? Tell it to Bill. Here are a couple of rides he's mulling over now:

THE FIRST IVW TRIATHALON: The contestants pour a water bottle over their heads, run 10 feet to the bicycles, and then cycle 200 miles. Obviously, the transition time between the three legs is the key.

THE MILLER-HAGEN DAAZ CHALLENGE: Each contestant climbs the followings hills in the area: Cedar Hills, Mossville, Detweiller, Forrest Hill, Grandview Dr., Fondulac, Springfield Rd., Kerfoot, and Centennial. At the apex of each ascent, the rider drinks one beer and eats one bowl of ice cream. The cyclists are then judged on time, style, grace under pressure, and overall effect. The winner is allowed to lie about yearly mileage, age (if applicable), and last training ride with Greg Lemond. Date is not yet set, Bill is working hard to interest sponsors in this unusual challenge.
