

Roger Jensen (father/spouse of above) has also been making his mark in the bicycling club. After a bad fall during cycling earlier this summer. Roser has some on



From an article on that great bicycle club, the IVW (Illinois Valley Wheelmen), to safety tips, and articles about club members such as Ken Kiley. Well, here's one you may not have read. It was located in THE COLBY FREE PRESS, VOL. 96, Colby, Kansas, July 23, 1985. If you want to read the entire article, call Edith Albright---or better yet, maybe she can bring it to the next meeting. 


