




### CYCLING SAFETY

Lee Iacocca says it won't sell cars, but in bicycles if you don't sell safety, pretty soon you'll have fewer cyclists to sell anything to. Several IVW members have mentioned their concerns about the seeming increase in serious bicycle accidents among the general public. The general public has beem fed enough misinformation about cycling over the past 60 years that many parents today teach their children to ride AGAINST traffic. Fatalities from "wrong way" accidents are 3 times higher than "right way" accidents.

I suggest the IVW set up a safety committee to work with other organizations to promote safe cycling. I feel that this is necessary to promote our club and our sport. Since the IVW is the only club in the Peoria area, we should feel a responsibility to help overcome public ignorance and govern-Because if we don't proment apathy. mote safety (and our right to the road) , someone else will promote it for us-and not necessarily to benefit cycling.

Cyclists fought against well-meant but stupid regulation in the early 70's. If we establish ourselves as the cycling authority in the area, we may be able to avoid another series of antibicycle "safety" regulations. We also will prevent needless injury and produce a more skilled cycling population.

### PACRACC

(Pantagraph Area Cyclist Ride Around Corn Country)

Cyclists from several states pounded the pedals for this 220 mile Labor Day weekend tour of McLean County. Of the aproximated 550 campers, 26 people represented Peoria at this fourth annual event.

All-you-can-eat breakfasts and suppers, plus the good supply of well-paved model-T roads combined to continue this ride's reputation as the best run multi-day tour in Central Illinois.

For many, this was their big bicycle outing of the year. Bicycles ranged from the department store variety to the ridiculously expensive. But many people took advantage of the training rides(starting in July) that build up to PACRACC. Three rides per week allowed even the novice to go from 8 miles to 50 miles in a day. Nearly 1/2 of the cyclists had never attempted PACRACC before. The most outstan ding characteristic of the ride is the number of people from the immediate Almost half Bloomington-Normal area. of the riders were from within the two towns' city limits.

Awards were presented, with handsome Jim Kelly, an IVW member now of New Mexico , winning the award for coming the farthest distance to attend.


