

Looking for a detailed summary of the most recent Race Across AMerica (RAAM)? The <u>Bloomington (Ind.) Bicycle Club</u> published it in their September newsletter. The type is small, but there is information you'll find nowhere else. Contact Sam(682-8777) for a copy.

The <u>Bicycle Forum</u> publishes the <u>BikeEd Newsletter</u>, devoted to bicycle safety issues six times each year. Based in Missoula, Montana, the newsletter contains film reviews, information on helmet standards, new publications, etc. This is a publication the IVW should consider for a subscription. \$12 per year. The <u>U.S. EPA</u> is releasing a videotape which promotes bicycle commuting to help reduce urban air pollution. The EPA sent with its announcement other information on bicycle use. According to their figures the average car needs a quarter per mile to operate where a bicycle costs less than a nickel.

It is fairly evident that the Illinois Department of Transportation could change its name to the Department of Automobile Celebration as a more accurate reflection of the truth, but not everything is dark and dreary. The Ohio Department of Transportion surely is a jewel in that state's crown of sanity. The DOT is now selling a set of maps covering the entire state, highlighting those roads best for bicycle use -- cost \$5. The cyclist can also request the following:

That's right, campers -- it's time to pat ourselves on the back and reward those deserving of reward. Following is an explanation of awards and a nominating ballot. Next month, you'll be asked to vote on those nominations. Please all nominations must be postmarked by October 1st.

- BROKEN SADDLE AWARD -- this award goes to that individual amassing the most mileage from <u>club</u> rides. Qualifying rides include any IVW ride example -- Time trials, Tuesday night beginner rides, Saturday morning Washington rides, etc. To be considered for this award the cyclist must submit an accurate mileage log. Log will be evaluated for club mileage in the period April through October 1. Entries must be postmarked before OCTOBER 15. Mail to: Greg Benning 12226 Lake Forest Dunlap, II. 61525
- HUB OF THE CLUB -- This award is presented to that person whom voting members of the club feel has done the most to promote the club. Nomination is either at the September meeting or no later than OCTOBER 1 by mail. Voting on the nominations takes place through the ballot provided in the October newsletter. Votes on nominations must be postmarked by NOVEMBER 1. Nomination ballot provided below.
- MOST IMPROVED MALE -- This award is presented to that male cyclist whom voting members of the club feel has improved his cycling the most during 1986. Nomination and Voting same as Hub of the Club.
- MOST IMPROVED FEMALE-- awarded to the female cyclist whom voting members feel has improved her cycling the most during 1986. Nomination and Voting same as Hub of the Club.
- Time Trial Awards -- Two time trial awards will be presented, one for best attendance and one for most improved time trialist. Winners of TT awards to be determined by the official time keeper Ron Johnson

With the following ballot, members are asked to nominate fellow members for the following three awards -- Hub of the Club, Most Improved Male Cyclist, and Most Improved Female Cyclist. All nominations must be postmarked by OCTOBER 1st. Nominations should be mailed to the Illinois Valley Wheelmen 6518 N. Sheridan Rd. Peoria, II. 61614. Nominations will be assessed by an Awards Committee appointed by the President. In the next newsletter, members will be asked to vote on those nominations.


