### Illinois Valley Wheelmen Guidelines for Ride Leaders

- Ask riders to sign a sign-up sheet so:
  - you know how many people and who is on your ride in case someone gets lost, hurt, etc.
  - you know about new and potential members and can introduce them
- 2. Please wear the name tag provided so that new members and non-members can get to know you.
- 3. Be sure to regroup at key intersections or have someone stay back to point the way.
- 4. Provide a sweep so that:
  - slow riders feel more a part of the group
  - if someone stops because they are sick, hurt, or have a breakdown someone can help them or get help
- 5. Whenever possible provide a cue sheet, map, or mark the route.
- 6. Review safe bicycling etiquette (hand signals, riding single or double file depending on traffic, etc.) with your riders and point out hazards such as holes, sewer grates, and railroad tracks.
- 7. If you are expecting a large group, it is suggested that you call ahead to the restaurant, so they can accommodate your group.

# Illinois Valley Wheelmen Ride Rating System

- 1. All IVW scheduled rides will be assigned a rating based upon the intended riding difficulty as determined by the ride leader.
- 2. Rides may have more than one rating if there are sufficient ride leaders to manage each group. (e.g. a ride may be rated NOVICE-INTERMEDIATE or INTERMEDIATE-EXPERT if there are leaders for each pace.)
- There are three levels of riders:

EXPERT

An expert rider is one who can and has ridden at least 100 miles in one day, can average a minimum of 15 miles per hour on a ride of 25 miles or more, and maintain his/her own equipment.

INTERMEDIATE

An intermediate rider is one who can and has ridden at least 50 miles in one day, can average a minimum of 12.5 miles per hour on a ride of 25 miles or more.

NOVICE

A novice rider is anyone who cannot meet the criteria of an intermediate rider.

- 4. If there are some people who want to ride at a pace faster than what is scheduled, the ride leader will ask for a volunteer to lead this group. The scheduled ride leader's responsibility to the faster group does not go beyond signing up their names, handing them cue sheets, and asking for a volunteer to lead the group. Beyond this, it is up to those riding in this group to decide when they want to stop, where they want to eat, whether there should be a sweep, etc.
- 5. As a responsible social organization, IVW should try to offer a schedule with all levels of rides. The purpose of the rating system is not to demean anyone's riding ability, but to avoid hard feelings caused by unmatched riders and rides.

NOTE: As the riding season progresses and regular riders become more fit, the pace may pick up some on the weekly Tuesday, Wednesday, and Saturday rides.
