RACE REPORT

The race season is now running along at full speed and there are some important events coming up in the next couple of months both from a racer's as well as a spectators's perspective.

One of the finest races in the area is being held at Oak Park on Sunday, June 5th. There is a \$25,000 prize list which is guaranteed to draw top national competitors. The race is held on a short criterium course designed for maximum speed and spectator viewing. There are also citizen events starting at 8:00am and participation is usually very high. USCF races start at 11:00am with the Cat. 4 race and continues until 5:00pm or so when the Junior events finish. The Pro and Senior 1,2 race is at 2:15 and will be as fast as any race in the country.

On June 12 are the Illinois State Road Races held at Coleta and Darrel Johnson will be there to defend his title. This is a very important event to the racers as they must place here to be eligible to compete at the national championships. Besides Darrel competing the Senior level, Jacob Tresenriter (Parental bragging will be allowed here! -ed.) and Marty Robinson have a chance to win their respective Junior categories. The entire team will be training hard for this one.

One of my favorite races is now a three day stage race. This race is held at Kankakee on July 2nd, 3rd, & 4th, with a time trial, criterium, and road race. This event is a prestige classic for women and juniors meaning that premier women and juniors from all over will attend. The criterium on July 3rd should be very exciting to see.

One of my main objectives this year is to defend my Illinois Criterium title on July 17th. This very fast course is located in by Buckingham Fountain on the lake front near downtown Chicago.

Marty Hamm is working on a race for Peoria this year to be held August 20th and 21st. We have not had a race in Peoria for several years so this is really something to get behind and support. I will have more on this later as details become available.

The best races in the area are held at Danvers and Bloomington on August 27th and 28th. These are great races and are so convenient to our area to go watch. Last year the racing talent was very good with several national caliber men and women coming to the race. This is definitely a "don't miss" race.
