



RIDE TYPE DESCRIPTIONS



- SOCIAL—Group paced ride, 15mph maximum (13-14 mph for rides over 25 miles) No passing the ride leader. This is a good pace for anyone who rides regularly and enjoys the security and social aspects of group riding.
- ATHLETIC--Generally ride at speeds above 15 mph at your desired pace. Recommended for those who enjoy faster cycling.
- ALL LEYEL-Ride atyour own pace. Regroup periodically, A "sweep" will make sure no one gets left behind or lost.
