RIDE TYPE DESCRIPTIONS

EASY—Group paced ride, 12mph maximum. No passing ride leader. Good ride for getting back on your bike after a long absence, parents with children, or anyone wanting a gentle pace.

SOCIAL—Group paced ride, 15mph maximum (13-14 mph for rides over 25 miles) No passing the ride leader. This is a good pace for anyone who rides regularly and enjoys the security and social aspects of group riding.

ATHLETIC--Generally ride at speeds above 15 mph at your desired pace. Recommended for those who enjoy faster cycling.

ALL LEVEL-Ride at your own pace. Regroup periodically, A "sweep" will make sure no one gets left behind or lost.


.Location of the on the East Side of the river early Saturday mornings time and place to allow for riders to make the 8:30 Washington Square ride after.


