BOARD MEETING MINUTES Jan. 10, 1990 from Ron Anderson, Sect.-Tres.

Attending. McMeekan, Hansen, Sally & Dalton Larson, Anderson, Weast, Hutchison, Grethey

Past Treasurer Steve Weast reported the IVW has \$1910.14 in Savings, and \$133.10 in the checking account. McMeekan, confirmed our re-registration in the L.A.W. The Board decided not to affiliate with Bikecentennial and AYH.

The board decided not to participate in the Dist. 150/Kiwanis program for recognizing student achievement in the Peoria schools with awards of new bicycles. Other ideas were discussed.

McMeekan presented information on the Regional Trail Advisory Task Force. A club member will be sought to sit on the task force. Hutchison indicated an interest if no other is found

Dalton Larson reported that the following are members of the ride committee: Dalton (chair), Randy Townsend, Steve Meismer, Ron Chandler, and Don Jacobs.

Dates for this year's major rides are: Pedal In (Ride on the Wild Side) Sat. June 2, 1990; Diane's Ride, Sunday August 26, 1990 (which will be secondarily referred to as "The State's Toughest Century" in promotional materials). McMeekan will confirm the date of the Pedal-In with Wildlife Prairie Park. Anderson will send info on both rides to the LAW and Bicycling magazine. Discussion indicated a desire to have registration forms for the Pedal-In out by April 1.

Board Member responsibilities will be as follows: Pres. McMeekan; VP. Hutchison; Sec./Tres. Anderson; Membership, Hutchison; Communication, Grethey; Social, Hansen and Hutchison; Rides, Larson.

A vacancy remains on the Board following the resignation of Mary Scroggs. Board responsibilities may change when the vacancy is filled. We discussed topics for monthly meetings.

The Board moved to spend approximately \$50 for a halftone screen for newsletter production.

FROM THE RIDE COMMITTEE "Leap Frog Ride III"

Because of the success of "Leap Frog Ride II", another ride is scheduled. This third"Leap Frog Ride" will take place on Sunday, February 11, 1990 at 11:00 a.m., and start at Groveland School in Groveland, II. This will be in leu of the normally scheduled 11:00 ride that starts from the same location.

As with the first and second ride, you'll need to find a partner to Leap with, so call up someone and join us

on Sunday Feb. 11th.

* A "Leap Frog Ride" is a ride with a tailwind only, and you need to have a partner to alternate riding with who will drive the car while you ride, and then switch off, while you drive—they ride, etc. As stated, it is a tail—wind ride, which will make it a little warmer if the weather is cold. Bundle up and be prepared to ride in any kind of weather and road condition.

The second Leap Frog Ride was even better than the first. It may not have been as colorful being that the riders and the cars didn't get seperated in different towns nor did the snow attack to cut things short, but the wind was stronger, and we went farther.

So once again the saga unfolds as ten hardy souls face the elements and the bleak wilds of the Illinois prairie in mid January. The departure point this month was from Groveland Grade School. The wind was a brisk 20 mph southwest gail. The riders headed toward Washington via Morton where the first switch would be made between drivers and riders. From Washington the group headed to Eureka and then on to Roanoke where the switch took place again. After a pow wow at Roanoke it was decided to go to Toluca for a lunch at Mona's. Half way there another switch was made to even the miles out. The total distance was about 55 miles.

Since the wind was brisk to say the least, the speeds were almost always over 20 mph and often certain parties just had to have sprints well over 30 mph just to show off. But it was great and all I can say is you should have been there if you weren't. Next Leap Frog Ride is on the 11th of February, 11 am, at Groveland Grade School. So get a partner, come on out and remember that the wind will be at your back.



MEMBER OF THE MONTH


