Barb Johnson, of Brimfield, a member of the IVW family is traveling from Lincoln City, Oregon to Rehoboth Beach, Delaware this summer and would like to have some encouraging words sent to her along the way. If you are so inclined, her schedule and the general directions for getting mail to her is as follows:

- 1. Allow a minimum of 5 days for delivery.
- The rider's name should appear only on the back of the envelope in the lower right-hand corner.
- If there is a legible return address, unclaimed mail will be returned to sender after fifteen days.
- 4. All packages must be mailed FIRST CLASS MAIL. If not, any packages missing the pick-up date deadline will be returned to the sender postage due. Packages mailed first class mail will be forwarded to the next mail stop.

The Administration of Wildlife Prairie Park has had to make the following policy: when bicyclists desire to use the restroom facilities at Wildlife Prairie Park they present their drivers license to the gatekeeper and they have 15 minutes to use the facilities and vacate the park. If the cyclist does not vacate the park in that time, they will be charged the usual fee to enter the park upon getting their license back. If you don't carry your license with you, you will not be allowed to use the facilities. Let's hope no one from the IVW is abusing this privilege, it could ruin our good relationship with Wildlife and the need to continue this relationship for the future of the "Ride on the Wild Side". ## DIANE'S RIDE UPDATE

Due to the unavailability of Lake Camelot on Aug. 26th, Diane's Ride has been Tentatively moved to Saturday, Sept. 29th. This is the same weekend as Apple Cider Century held in Michigan. The Board has been in discussion lately concerning this matter and we need input from the membership. Due to the fact that ... many of the Board members and workers for the ride have made plans to go to Apple Cider, we will need help from you folks out there, or there will not be a Diane's Ride this year. CATEGORY A...Aggressive rider - capable of going long distances at above average pace. Capable of riding alone if lost or dropped.

Knowledgeable of high speed group riding techniques such as pace lining.

CATEGORY B...Intermediate rider - capable of long distance rides at a reasonable rate (15 to 18 mph ave). Knowledgeable of group riding techniques.

CATEGORY C...Social rider - not interested in vigorous exercise. This also could be someone unfamiliar with group riding, the route, or their equipment. This rider can expect assistance from the group if necessary.
