CATEGORY C...Social rider - not interested in vigorous exercise. This also could be someone unfamiliar with group riding, the route, or their equipment. This rider can expect assistance from the group if necessary.

PEORIA'S BICYCLING HISTORY

The book <u>BICYCLE FEVER</u> written by Steven Streight has just been published by Ruppman Marketing Services, Inc. in Peoria. This book, complete with rare photos, paints an excellet picture of bicycling in the "Central City" during cycling's early heyday (1800's). In those days, Peoria was a nationally recognized bicycling center complete with 8 cycling clubs, 5 cycle manufacturers, and a 1/2 mile race track (complete with large grandstands) in Lakeview Park. Informative and entertaining, copies are on sale now at Vitesse & Russell's Bike Shops and Junction City Book Store.

There is a telephone hotline you can call to get recorded cycling news which is updated daily. Example items include regional ride calendar & Tour De France updates. Cost is \$0.95/ min with portion of proceeds supporting cycling organizations such as Ultra Marathon Cycling Assn. The magic number is 1-900-246-2453 (1-900-2GO-BIKE) with a bumper sticker available if you really get excited about what you hear.

Miscellaneous

According to the Washington Post, out of the top 15 political action committees (PACs) in 1989, three were from the transportation industries: The Teamsters Voter Education Committee came in third with contributions of \$629,312; the Air Line Pilots Association was 5th with \$547,797; and the United Auto Workers Voluntary Community Action Program contributed \$408,478 to political races in 1989. The United Parcel Service was 24th with \$304,792 of contributions in the off-election year. Ninety percent of PAC funds were donated to incumbents, and these were usually to members of Congressional committees with jurisdictions over the PAC's industry and unions.

Maryland's Montgomery County has imposed a \$120 per employee parking place tax for both paid and private lots to pay for its suburban roads. This "commuter tax" stems from a mobile work force that commutes into the county daily, but doesn't pay property tax, which is the usual source for construction funds.


