As part of its new policy to consider bicycle accommodations on all new state highway projects, the Illinois Department of Transportation has asked for IVW input on a major East Peoria roadway project. As stated in the letter we received from the local IDOT office, Illinois Route 8 (Washington St) is targeted for upgrade between Rosedale Road (East Peoria) and US 24 (Washington). Plans include widening to four traffic lanes, one center turn lane, and sidewalks. IDOT wants to know if bicycle accommodations are needed on this road.
