The first weekend of May, the McGuire family, my wife, one of my daughters, and myself, traveled to Turkey Run State Park in Indiana. The Parke County Covered Bridge Ride held was Rockville just south of the park. The ride started in a small historic village on

the edge of Rockville called Billie Creek. It is a collection of old buildings with craft and souvenir shops. There are also two covered bridges in the village. There was a choice of three rides, a 13 mile route with a 10 mile added loop, if you wanted, a 36, and a 39 mile routes.

We chose the 13 and 10 mile loops, considering we were riding with our two teenage daughters on their single bikes, and Dirk's wife was on her single. The area is on the hilly side, but it is very scenic. The biggest complaint was the fact that there was only one covered bridge on our route. 3rd Annual Tunnel Trail Ride (Elroy-Sparta Trail)

Rob Alexander and I will be filling in for Bill Semmens as hosts for this year's trip to Wisconsin. The dates for the trip are July 17,18, & 19. Over the last two years this has been one of IVW's most popular rides. For those who are familiar with the event, please pass your experiences on to others who may be contemplating attending this year. Arrival is anytime Friday July 17th. The trip takes 4½ to 5 hours via I-74 East to I-39 to I-90 or I-74 west to 61 North in Iowa and Wisconsin. The former route is nearly all interstate, for those of you camper-bound, the later is scenic and twisty up in Wisconsin for the adventurous.

We set up camp as a group in Wilton's public park. (\$6.00 per night) The park is located in the Southeast corner of Wilton behind the swimming pool. We get to use the pool and showers. There are no reservations or marked spots in the campground. Saturday morning at 9:00am we will head East as a group to the end of the trail at Elroy and then turn North to Camp Douglas on the Omaha Trail, a county trail which is asphalt.

The Elroy-Sparta trail is crushed limestone, not very dusty but does get muddy in the rain. Fees for the State trail are \$3:00 per day, the county trail \$1:00. There is a tunnel on both these trails; lights of some type are required. Lunch is at a smorgasbord at the end of the trail on highway 12/16 which parallels 190 (bring cash). Wilton to Eiroy is 15 miles, Eiroy to Camp Douglas 12 miles for a 54 mile day. Those who do not wish to go the distance can find food and fun anywhere along the route.

Saturday night we will have a pot-luck in the park shelter. If you want to participate in the meal bring a dish, if you want a share of Rob's smoked turkey breast, call to confirm and contribute \$1 per person to help defray the cost. Sunday morning the Wilton Lions supply a pancake breakfast at the pool for about \$4:00. Sunday everyone can take on whatever distance they have left. Some will go West to Sparta (two tunnels) others may want to explore the adjacent trails; LaCrosse River State Trail West out of Sparta or the 400 Trail South out of Elroy. Breaking camp to return to Peoria is whenever you like.

These trails are suitable for all types of bicycles. The old railroad bed rises gradually to tunnels so climbs are long but not steep. The biggest hill is up to the Western tunnel coming out of Sparta. Wilton to Sparta is 17 miles (34 round trip). If you go through the last tunnel, which is a mile long, and then avoid the hill by turning around and going back, the round trip is 19 miles. The adjacent trails can add as many miles as you can stand on the Sunday ride.

If you have any questions, want to confirm for the turkey, or want to caravan or carpool, call Rob or me. We'll try to keep a list of those seeking assistance and put you together with others.
