Watch for the new IVW "Mini Invi" coming in Sept. Routes will be marked and mapped with sag support. There will be no mass start, just small groups until everyone is gone. Registration times will be listed. Points of interest will be pointed out, with area festivals the center of attention.

Accurate route maps will be provided to all riders so that they know where they are and where they're going. Route length will vary from 25 to 50 miles. Cost will be kept to an absolute minimum, usually about \$7.00 per person, \$1.00 per child. IVW members receive a discount. This is something new for the club.
