NEWS FLASH!!! PUNKIN FESTIVAL RIDE

Here it is Folks! You asked for it, so we are delivering. The IVW'S first "mini invitational". Tired of sitting at home while everyone else is out doing day long rides. Does your schedule not allow you to leave town for a full day to do rides that those "single people" get to do. Not sure if you want to get so far from home without some support. Well now we have the cure. The first annual "Punkin Festival Ride"

There is a twenty five mile route and a 35 mile route. Both routes will be mapped and marked. Both routes will be sagged. Our Sag vehicle will have tools for minor repairs, fix flats, give out cold water, or friendly conversation while we haul your broken steed back to the start. Most often we will just pass quietly by with a friendly wave and a hello, just to let you know you are not out there alone.

The longer route will have one rest stop on it. This may be a park or a Casey's where you can take care of your own needs. (so bring money) Both routes go through Morton for the annual Pumpkin Festival. Stop and eat and rest a while, before returning to Tremont. I will gladly haul any souvenirs you pick up back for you. Here are all the particulars.

Routes: 25 and 35 miles

Terrain: Flat to rolling, with a couple of doozies thrown in for good measure. Starts at: Registration from 9:00 a.m., to 10:30 a.m. September 19 at; Tremont park, south side, by the swimming pool. From Peoria take I-74 east to I-155 south. Take the route 9 west exit into Tremont. Park is on North side of road about mid way through town.

Features: Tour some of the beautiful Mackinaw river valley before heading to Morton for the annual Pumpkin Festival. All routes are on lightly traveled secondary paved roads.
