On behalf of the Board of Trustees of Pedals for Progress, I wish to express our sincere thanks for your generous contribution of \$200 to support our ongoing efforts.

1998 Interplanetary Bicycle Ride Wrap-up.

This past July, 200 riders went where "no bike had gone before", where previously only unmanned space probes had visited.

Clearly, the Interplanetary Bicycle Ride has developed a reputation for extremes; the first year was 96, the second 64, and last year it was 99 degrees. (Outer space has that reputation too!) However, after three years of extremes, it finally was our turn for perfect weather, 80 degrees and partly cloudy. With that came the riders, as walk-in registration doubled the ride. All told, nearly 200 rode Saturday, and 40 rode Sunday on our Fourth Annual "Interplanetary Bicycle Ride."

How hot will it be July 24th and 25 for the 1999 Interplanetary Bicycle Ride? Tune in next year to find out.

From the IVW, special thanks go out to Ron Jetton, who did the Saturday route marking (with help from Chris Meydam); Lynn Anderson-Loy, who did the Sunday route marking and led a group on Sunday; and Eric Hutchinson, Larry Paustian, and Rob Alexander, who led groups on the Sunday ride. Weekend Rides 15-25 miles


