Bill Motteler and Lauren Malmberg from the Peoria Animal Shelter spoke to us about dogs at the April meeting.

Here are some notes from their informative talk:

Why dogs chase

There are many reasons why dogs chase cyclists: they like to chase and run, they're defending their territory, they're curious, they're hunting, etc. Many times, the dog will stop at the edge of their owner's property. But if it doesn't

How to prevent dogs from attacking

Many suggestions were offered by Bill. Lauren and the audience. Often times you just need to break the dog's attention by loudly yelling "no" or by using a whistle or horn. Some of the animal control officers carry a highpitched (silent) battery-operated whistle called a "dazer" which can be purchased from pet supply companies such as R.C. Steele at 1-800-872-3773. (www.rcsteele.com) Pepper spray is often ineffective because of the wind and also because you have to be fairly close to the dog. Squirting the animal with water from your water bottle sometimes works. Depending on your fitness and the dog's, sometimes you can outrun the animal. If the animal is very aggressive, you may need to stop, get off your bike and put the bike between you and the dog. You can also use your tire pump as a weapon. In the case of a vicious attack and you can't get away, Lauren and Bill advised that you should curl up and protect your torso and neck. Also try to be passive and quiet while curled up to not incite the dog further.

What recourse do you have if you are chased or attacked? Contact your local animal control!

In Peoria County call the Peoria Animal Shelter 686-7297. The address is 2600 NE Perry, behind Glen Oak Park. In Tazewell County call 925-3370. In Peoria County, you can call to report a problem or you can sign an official complaint. If a complaint is signed, the owner will be fined and the animal control officer will check on all animals at that residence. If animals don't have up-to-date rabies tags, etc., even more fines can be assessed. The basic fine for the dog owner is \$50 for the first offense if they reside in the country. \$25 for the first offense if they live in the city of Peoria. It quickly goes up from there. If you do need to report a problem or file a complaint, try to capture a few details. Having a description of dog (color, size), address or approximate location of where you think the dog lives will help the animal control officer find the owner.

Do report problems!

You may be preventing injury to another cyclist, runner, children in the neighborhood, and even to the dog. One person told of being attacked by a dog while riding. The dog grabbed his wheel, which tossed him off. The rider wasn't seriously hurt and chased the dog away. However, the next day another rider passed by the same dog, was tossed off and broke some bones. The first person felt very bad about not having reported his own encounter with this dog, knowing that he might have been able to prevent the second person's injuries. Happy Cycling! Patty

BIKE QUAD CITIES

June 2-4, 2000

Friday evening we'll set up camp at Illiniwek Forrest Preserve on the East bank of the Mississippi River. This is an Illinois state park on highway 84 just a few miles South of Interstate 80 where it crosses the Mississippi River. You can't miss it – if you're in lowa, turn around. Travel time is about 1.5 hours, less than 100 miles. You'll find us on the riverbank, which is one of the tent areas; pads are available close by.

On Saturday morning at 9:00 A.M. the ride will leave the campground on the trail and travel the length of the Ben Butterworth Memorial Parkway to Codova (North) and back past the campground into Rock Island Arsenal (South) along the river-fronts of a half dozen cities with side trips to any number of the Mississippi Islands. There are tails on the Arsenal and civil war era buildings, cemeteries, and a museum (Helmets are required). From the Arsenal we can ride over the car/train bridge into downtown Davenport and continue our ride on the River Front Trail through Davenport and out onto Credit Island providing spring flooding doesn't close the causeway. To go all the way is about 55 miles. Dinner Saturday night will be at Miss Mamie's Catfish House. This place is cheep and good, but bring your own food if you want.

The ride time Sunday is 9:00 A.M. in Bettendorf, lowa at Devil's Glen Park. We'll ride the Duck Creek Parkway across Bettendorf and Davenport, a round trip of 27 miles. Lunch will be at McDonalds on the trail. Only three streets cross this paved trail. It is a linear park stretching across two cities. Afterwards we will return to Peoria in the afternoon.

All the trails are flat and asphalt, but wider tires are usable at the camp and for some side trips onto the Mississippi Islands. Maps have been published in previous years newsletters and I'll be carrying some around with me. Call me if you plan to come along. Larry Paustian, 694-3947.

200 in 2000!!!

Have you ever thought about doing a really long bike ride all in one day? How about thinking about a 200 mile day. Sounds Impossible!!! Well it's not. Nothing is impossible when you set your mind to it. If you did a century last year, you may be

ready to try a 200 mile day. Start building your miles up this spring and you should be ready by June.

Here is the plan. There is a nice, square 50 mile loop that we can do out of Metamora. Do that four times and you have your 200 mile day. The ride will take place on June 17th and start at 6:00 A.M. That's pretty close to the longest day of the year so we should have about 15 hours to complete our task. The route starts in Metamora, goes north to Washburn, then goes east and then south near Eureka and then returns to Metamora.

It will be a self supported ride, but I'll try to collect names of people who are interested and we can talk about food, etc. I've done this ride two times now and can advise you on how to train and what you might want to eat the day of the ride.

So mark June 17th on your calendar and start training. Even if you can't do 200, come out and do as many loops as you can. The 200-milers will appreciate the company.

Ride Leaders - Bill & Marge Semmens We will ride two different loops out of Johnson - Sauk Trail State Park. Both the Sat. and Sun. rides will begin from the

Sat. and Sun. rides will begin from the camp area (there is only one) at 9 A.M. Since most folks will be in the tent area, that is where we'll meet. We have a popup camper and will attempt to get a camping spot adjacent to the tent area.

Friday evening we will have a wiener roast. Bring your own dogs, buns, and something simple to share. We'll provide the condiments and fire, of course we all create the atmosphere around the campfire. We also have some forks we can all share for roasting. Wine & beer are acceptable beverages.

We will bike Sat. about 35 or 40 miles using the Corners-and-Sweep method. There is no good place to stop for lunch on this route so you will need to pack your own or rely on a brief stop at Casey's. This will be the more leisurely ride of this two day event so don't be disheartened by the miles - we have all day.

Saturday evening we will have a pot luck. This year we are bringing chili in the crockpot so bring something that might compliment that or basically any dish you like - deserts are always good. If you can't stay to camp but wish to join us for Sat. potluck, there are showers you can use. Bring a lawn chair and stay awhile.

Both Sat. and Sun. morning we will provide coffee at our campsite. You are basically on your own for breakfast, so pack a bagel, fruit, or whatever. We will leave Sun. at 9:00 A.M. for a little longer ride to Bishop Hill. Lunch will be at the family restaurant. The food last year was great.

There is a fee for camping - tent camping was \$7 or \$8 per night with electric \$11 per night. These are approximate rates, very reasonable.

We will have a brief introductory meeting to get acquainted with new members & answer any questions. Since our monthly bicycle club meeting is on May 10th we thought we would tag our brief meeting on after the regular meeting--see elsewhere in the newsletter for details. We are looking forward to making new biking acquaintances and seeing some "old" friends. Call 693-9688 for questions or just to let us know you'll be there. Again, this park is only one hour from Peoria so camping is not mandatory, lots of options. Ride and camp, ride and don't camp, always eat. PS: There is a fishing lake in the park and some hiking trails.

How much? The cost of the optional breakfast is \$12 for adults. Since we need to know how many will join us for breakfast, please submit your reservation with payment by April 24. Donations are welcome.

Who is RTA? The Recreational Trail Advocates is comprised of individuals representing many different interests/activities - commuting, bicycling, walking, running and the environment. RTA is dedicated to addressing trail-related issues throughout Central Illinois. Issues include: expanding the trail network for commuting and recreation; promoting safe and proper use of trails; programming trail activities and events; and maintaining and enhancing trails. IVW RIDE CATEGORIES

Beginner Category/Level 0:
Beginning rides for families or
individuals. Average speed 6-10 mph.
Loop rides within or not very far from
town. Friendly, social rides with an
emphasis on fun, as well as learning
basic safety and bicycling skills. Expect
to ride as a group - individuals should
not ride too far in front of the group (i.e.,
out of sight of the rest of the group), and
no one will be left to ride alone behind
the back of the group. Anyone having
mechanical or physical difficulties can
expect the group to stop and lend
assistance.

Leisure Category/Level 1: For cyclists competent with basic safety and bike handling skills - should have experience riding in a group. Average speed 8-12 mph. Most of the ride should be done in the group format - pace and distance encourage group discussion, socializing, and riding, with some emphasis on improving group riding skills. No one will be left to ride alone behind the group, and anyone having mechanical difficulties can expect the group to stop and lend assistance.

Touring Category/Level 2: For experienced cyclists with substantial group riding experience wishing to concentrate on improving individual and group riding skills as well as physical

fitness, with an emphasis on pace lines, some sprinting and intervals, etc. Average speed 12-15 mph. Individuals experiencing mechanical difficulties can expect a few members of the group to stop and lend assistance, including "pulls" to rejoin the main group. Group will stop occasionally to regroup with stragglers. Although physically challenging, emphasis is still on group riding for fun.

Fitness Category/Level 3: These are semi-competitive rides with Average speeds of 15-18 mph for extended distances. Riders are expected to be fully competent with pace lines, sprints, intervals, etc. These are physically demanding rides, dropped riders will probably be on their own, although those with mechanical difficulties may find a few members of the group willing to stop and lend assistance, including "pulls" to rejoin the main group.

Animal Category/Level 4: Those riders that start out with the group and then pull away after they get warmed up. They can expect to ride by themselves!

IVW Rules of the Ride 2000

Group riding skills are an important part of the fun of IVW rides, so please review the good group riding skills and safety habits IVW expects of all bicyclists participating in IVW rides. Use these Rules of the Ride as your guide.

- Ride no more than 2 abreast single file in traffic and at intersections.
- Pass only on the left and announce your intentions by calling out "On your left."
- When riding in a large group, create space to help motorists pass safely.
- Maintain a safe distance from the rider ahead of you.
- Check all intersections for traffic. Avoid "group think".
- 6. If you stop, pull completely off the road.
- Always ride with, never against, traffic.
- Obey traffic signs and signals, markings and regulations.
- Use hand signals to indicate left turns, right turns, and stops.
- Warn the riders behind you of pot holes, dogs, cars (up, back, left, right), and other obstacles on the road.
- 11. Check your bike before every ride to be sure it's in safe operating condition.
- All riders should arrive 15 minutes before start times - rides will leave promptly at the stated start time.

ALWAYS WEAR YOUR HELMET when riding your bike! Accident prevention is the first principle of safety, but accidents sometimes do happen. Helmets are the best means of minimizing head injuries.
