Get Ready To Rumble: The Latest On The Rumble Strip Debate

The League is leading a national effort to find a rumble strip design that effectively alerts motorists, but is also safe for bicyclists. The League's Tim Young has developed a series of bicycle-safe designs.

He and other members of the League's rumble strip team have been speaking with Congressman Oberstar, Transportation Secretary Slater, Federal Highways Administration chief Wykle, and Oberstar's staff to push FHWA to test the bicycle-safe designs as part of an effort to develop state and federal standard rumble strip designs.

League News

Springfield -- Governor George H. Ryan today reaffirmed his pledge to support completion of the Grand Illinois Trail, the 475-mile loop trail connecting the Mississippi River to Lake Michigan through northern Illinois, proclaiming June 2nd and 3rd as "Trails Days" in the state of Illinois to coincide with the National Trails Day which is observed on June 3.

"The Grand Illinois Trail provides a connection for trail users to our state's rich array of natural resources, beautiful and scenic vistas, and our significant cultural and historical heritage," Ryan said. "The Grand Illinois Trail provides links to outstanding recreational opportunities, is a boost to local tourism throughout the region and helps connect people with people."

The Grand Illinois Trail is being developed through partnerships involving municipal and county governments, park and forest preserve districts, local organizations, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and the Illinois Department of Transportation.

At present, more than 200 miles of the Grand Illinois Trail are open. Another 100 miles of new trails are under construction, while state and federal funding is being secured for another 50 miles of new trails.
