Kewanee Ride

Come join us for a fun-filled two day bike riding adventure in the beautiful Kewanee area May 19 & 20. A great outdoor weekend is planned for all levels of riders. We'll set up our base at the Johnson-Sauk Trail Park off Route 78. We will be camped around sites 20-24 in the pine trees. When you get there, go directly to the sites and check in with us. Don't stop at the Host Site. Campsites with electricity will cost \$11.00/day. The primitive campsites cost \$7.00/day. Here is our general plan for the weekend.

Friday – Drive to Kewanee (about one hour from Peoria) Hot dog, marshmallow roast over campfire, condiments provided, bring your own dogs to roast.

Saturday – Breakfast (on your own, but we'll probably have a pot of coffee). About 9:00 A.M. we'll mount up and ride to Sheffield, IL. Total distance about 38 miles. If 38 is too long, I know a shortcut that cuts the ride down to 31 miles, but it's a highway. We plan to stop at a Casey's but there will not likely be a restaurant. There may be time for a hike or whatever when we get back. The park has many trails around the lake. This is also a great fishing lake. Supper – Potluck, we will bring chicken & noodles. Bring a dish to share. Probably eat about 6:00 P.M.

Sunday – Breakfast (on your own again). About 9:00 A.M. we'll saddle up again and head for Bishop Hill for Lunch. Today will be about 50 miles, with as many hills as we can find. There will be a couple of great downhills. There is at least one restaurant in Bishop Hill, but nothing in between.

Also note: Ride length and destination may vary with conditions. Day riders are welcome. Just try to get there about 8:30 A.M. so we can leave the park by 9:00 A.M. Trip leaders: Marge & Bill Semmens - 693-9388. Call if you have questions. We also need a headcount for Sunday's restaurant.
