40+ at Annual Poker Ride

This year's ride was a great success despite the high winds and threatening rain. Most everyone was able to complete the 10 mile route without getting wet. The highest poker hands were held by Kim White. Jackie Robbins, and Mary Reiter who all received great prizes. Interplanetary Ride Report

This was the 8th year for the Interplanetary Bicycle Ride, and for the third straight year in August we avoided 90 degree temperatures, although this year was close, topping out at 89 degrees. Luckily, the day started in the 60's, capping a week of very pleasant temperatures. A light preregistration was more than doubled on the day of the ride, with a final total of 141. including families, and 14 new riders showed up for Sunday's city ride through the inner solar system, bringing the total to 155 (identical to last year's).

As in past years, riders enjoyed great premiums, fine food in generous amounts, interesting routes, timely sag service and personal attention to their problems, fascinating displays & sunspot viewing, well organized rest areas, and a perfect facility for registration and end-of-ride pasta. Virtually every aspect of the ride was special.

Riders came from 5 states, and 43% came from outside the tri-county area, 34% more than 50 miles away, and 63% were on the ride for the first time. Our survey of riders also showed a clear preference for

our August date, so next year we will keep the ride the 2nd weekend in August, the 9/10th of August 2003.

RTA NEWS

The Recreational Trail Advocates had their monthly meeting on 9-10-02. Topics discussed included the Kickapoo Creek Greenway Project. Tri-County Regional Planning Commission got \$15,000 to go toward a study of streambank stabilization. This is for the canoe trail from Wildlife Prairie Park to Bartonville.

The Kellar Branch Trail has been one of the hot topics in the editorial page. The big hold-up is the need of an easement across CILCO property as many of you know. George Burrier has been in contact with Ameren Corp. of St. Louis and they seem to be very agreeable. Unfortunately they cannot commit to anything until the sale of CILCO is approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the Department of Justice, the Securities & Exchange Commission, and the Illinois Commerce Commission. We are sending them some maps and additional info to bring their Manager of Economic Development up to speed on this and hopefully sway him to our way of thinking.

George next got in touch with Steve Van Winkle . He is working on the rail spur enhancement despite these holdups. Steve said that CILCO wants \$210,000 for the easement across their property. Poles have to be moved and lost parking spaces have to be made up for. The City of Peoria, we believe has accepted this price as reasonable, to get this project rolling. The Park District has the grant to do the trail but this money cannot be spent on land acquisition. Now would be a great time for our members to write editorials to PJS and help sway the general public on the good of this RECREATIONAL TRAIL. The strange misconception by the public is that the average person isn't going to use this trail. They also can see no economic benefit to the area. We, as cyclists, know how these trails benefit the communities we live in. We also know how much cash we spend for

meals and boarding when we travel to other trails.

HIKEMABIKA, On Sunday, October 13, the Friends of the Hennepin Canal are having a special event. It all takes place at Geneseo Campgrounds, 11:30 to 5:00. Hike, bike or canoe, at your own pace. When this trail is finished it will be 105 miles long.

October 25, 2002 a Greenways and Trail conference is scheduled at Wildlife Prairie. Many exceptional panelists will be speaking. Public welcome.

Blaze the trail on a brand new, grand new ride

A new seven-day bicycle tour is coming to America -- put on by the League of Illinois Bicyclists (LIB), in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR). The ride will boost bicycling as a health and fitness incentive to ride the trails and roads of northern Illinois - and to visit and experience some very unique natural resources - Illinois State Parks.

Much of the route will be on the Grand Illinois Trail and riders will camp in Illinois State Parks along the way (with motel or cabin opportunities close to every one of the overnight sites.)

The ride is called the Grand Illinois Trail And Parks ride, or GITAP. And although the ride is still in the planning stage, both the LIB and the IDNR have agreed that it will take place next year from Sunday, June 15 through Saturday, June 21. So after getting in shape with spring and early summer

rides, you'll be set for a relatively leisurely week exploring the grand concept of the Grand Illinois Trail.

This will be the first ride sponsored cooperatively by the LIB and The IDNR; consequently ridership will be kept within limits. If you're interested at this early date, mail or call and your name will be put in our reserved file. You will be sent a registration brochure as soon as it is printed.

As of now, these are the features of this unique trail and parks ride:

- A seven day, six nights, ride of about 60-70 miles a day.
- Starting on Sunday, June 15, 2003, and ending on Saturday, June 21.
- The route follows the Grand Illinois Trail for much of its length.
- Overnight camping in Illinois' State Parks, for the most part.
- Each overnight is also close to a town with motel accommodations.
- Breakfasts and dinners provided lunch on your own.
- Evening meetings sometimes with entertainment and discussion.
- The ride starts close to Chicago, in the western suburbs (Oswego).

The route includes the following overnights:
