LEAGUE OF AMERICAN BICYCLISTS UPDATE

The League has been following and discouraging distracted driving with a myriad of other organizations, states, individuals and the U.S. Department of Transportation. Now Delaware joins the ranks. Governor of Delaware Jack Markell signed a law on July 6 making Delaware the eighth state to ban hand-held mobile phone use while driving. The law becomes effective on January 2, 2011. "We had too many people who were driving while distracted," Markell said. "These new laws should be a deterrent. It should make people think twice." While 29 other states prohibit texting and driving, Delaware joins a smaller group that prohibits all phone use behind the wheel. The ban also applies to electronic games, PDAs and laptops. Cyclists can feel a little safer in Illinois thanks to new legislation signed on July 5 by Governor Pat Quinn. The legislation, which goes into effect January 1, 2011, establishes new penalties for motorists who drive dangerously or unnecessarily close to bicyclists -- drivers in violation of this law could be sentenced to a year in prison and fined \$2,500. Illinois will also create Share the Road license plates. Money made from the plates will go to bicycle education campaigns. Learn more about the new legislation at www.bikelib.org

Seeking New Board Members

If you are interested in serving on the <u>League Board of Directors</u>, or if you know someone who would be a good representative for cyclists, the League Governance Committee is soliciting recommendations for candidates for the <u>2011 Board elections</u>.

The Board of Directors governs and sets broad policy and direction for the League. Board members serve three-year terms. Starting this year, seven are elected nationally by all League members. The Board selects the remaining five seats. Four member-elected and one Board-appointed positions are open for this election. As of press time, all four elected members -- Harry Brull, Jeffrey Lynne, Hans van Naerssen, and Bill Hoffman -- have decided to run again. In addition, the League's Bylaws allow the Board the option to create up to five additional Board seats for a total that may range from the current 12 up to 17.

Share the Road License Plate "Share the Road" license plate (Senate Bill

2798) – **PASSED!** State Senator Michael Bond and State Representative Joe Lyons were lead sponsors of our bill to enable production of a permanent "Share the Road" license plate for Illinois. The plates will include the messages "Share the Road" and "Same Rights, Same Rules", and the \$22 incremental cost for these plates will fund LIB's Share the Road public education programs for motorists and bicyclists. LATEST STATUS (May 17, 2010): The bill has passed the legislature! On April 22, SB2798 passed the House by a vote of 105-8, following earlier victories in the Senate (32-7-1) and both chambers' committees. LIB will now ask the Governor's office to schedule a signing ceremony. Afterwards, we can we begin working with the Secretary of State to design and, later, offer the plates to the public. Thanks go to our great sponsors, plus all other legislators who co-sponsored and/or voted Yes on the bill.

Anti-Harassment Bill (Senate Bill 2951) -

PASSED. State Senator Ira Silverstein introduced a bill establishing penalties for motorists driving recklessly and unnecessarily close to, toward, or near a bicyclist. Depending on whether serious injuries result, it is either a Class A misdemeanor or Class 4 felony. The bill also makes throwing objects at cyclists a Class A misdemeanor. LATEST STATUS (May 17,2010) SB2951 was approved by the House on April 21 by a vote of 93-20-1, and now awaits the Governor's signature. The section on throwing objects was removed in an amendment on March 15, and the remaining bill passed the Senate 55-0-2 on March 18. Rep. Sente was the chief House sponsor for the bill, with 21 co-sponsors.

MEMBER PROFILE



Dave and Janice Atkinson

Dave and Janice Atkinsons' new and unique Wheelm'n ride was born from a love for their bike-friendly, easily accessible, flower-blossomy East Bluff neighborhood -- and a desire to share it with others.

"It's perfect for making our way to the Riverfront Trail by way of Springdale Cemetery," says Dave. And if you make your way far enough on a summer Saturday, then another pleasure awaits – the Riverfront Market. So on the second Saturday, June through September, the Atkinsons invite club members to see how many watermelons they can stuff into their panniers and backpacks on the ride back home. It's uphill.

Shopping by bike is a habit for the Atkinsons. Among the places Janice says she and Dave reach on two wheels are the meat market, the Dollar Store, Emo's, the July 3rd fireworks at Glen Oak Park and Walgreen's. They use the drive-through to pick up prescriptions.

Dave says he can't remember when he wasn't on a bike. When he was too little to cycle by himself, he rode on the back of his brother's bike. "When we went to Mr. Donut, my job was to hold the donuts," he says. With help from his brother and father, Dave began working on bikes early as well. "We just always had bikes and tools."

Like Dave, Janice has always been a biker. "I remember being five and I got my red bike with a steel seat and training wheels for my birthday," she says. "There was no going back."

Dave says he had a boys bike of the same version and "rode it until I could ride it no more." Janice, however, advanced to a Sting Ray and, by age 10, to a 10-speed. As with Dave, her father taught her how to repair her bike. "Soon the neighborhood kids were coming to me to fix theirs," she says.

So it shouldn't be surprising that the Atkinsons met while biking. That was 27 years ago, and the bikes they were into at the time had motors. They married three years later and, as time went on, ditched the motors. They say they enjoy the social aspect of biking – the people, the stories, the friendships.

A native Peorian, Dave is a third-generation Peoria High School graduate. Other than a year of schooling in Tennessee, he's never left his hometown for long. For the last 13 years, he's been a collision repair technician for Collision Revision in Pioneer Park. He says it's "wonderfully satisfying work to take a wrecked car and put it back to precrash condition."

It helps that Dave loves to work with his hands and especially loves working on cars – an affection he traces back to boyhood when he built models from kits. "I look at these cars and it's just a big model kit, only it's a skill level 100 and there's no directions," he says.

Having moved to Washington when she was small, Janice graduated from Washington High School, then went to work at Foster & Gallagher. She spent 10 years shuffling money and papers, she says, until daughter Heather was born and she chose to stay home. Heather will be a Eureka College senior.

"After Foster & Gallagher, I swore my next job would have to be fun," Janice says, and that's what led me to Toys R Us."

For the last 13 years, she's worked in sales and merchandising at Russell's Cycling and Fitness. Occasionally, when things are especially busy, she gets to make use of those skills learned as a child and change a tube or adjust a brake. "It's fun to show off a little," she says.


It was biking that took Janice from Toys R Us to Russell's. "I woke up one morning and decided I wanted a mountain bike." She bought it on layaway – remember layaway? One day Janice came into the store to make a payment and noticed how busy it was. So she approached Joe Russell, whom she'd known in high school, and asked if he needed help. "Call me sometime," he said. She did. Dave also works on bikes at Russell's during busy times. "I'm a relief team member," he says.

At the garage behind their Maywood Avenue home, the Atkinsons have bikes for every purpose, including single speeds. They also have kayaks, model cars, antiques, a woodshop and video games. Dave says the garage is their playroom – "We still like our toys; we're kids at heart."


When they're not biking, working or in the playroom, the Atkinsons might be found hiking, bowling or enjoying their two Norwegian Elkhounds. They have an attachment that allows them to "bike" the dogs around their neighborhood. At the invitation of her daughter, Janice recently rediscovered an old favorite hobby – roller skating.

But biking remains at the top of the list, and family biking vacations are a fond memory. On one such trip, they mounted a plastic gnome on Heather's bike and took pictures of it riding along or stopping to look at the scenery. Evidently, more than two Atkinsons know how to have fun.

Monday Dunlap Level I: Bonnie Johnson (682-7771) will lead this ride departing from Dunlap Grade School at 6:00 p.m. Ride distance will be 15 miles early in the season and will lengthen through the summer. The group will ride together and regroup frequently.

Ride Levels:

(Ride leaders can be contacted for specific details concerning their rides.)

<u>Beginner/Family</u>: These rides are at a casual pace averaging less than 12 miles per hour and ride as a group.

<u>Level I</u>: Rides average 12-14 miles per hour and regroup on a regular basis.

<u>Level II</u>: Rides average 13-17 miles per hour and regroup occasionally.

<u>Level III</u>: Rides average 17 miles per hour and over. Riders may regroup periodically but should be prepared to ride in pace lines to keep from being dropped.

Show & Go: Rides have **NO** leaders. The distance and speed are decided upon by the group, but governed by the ride level designated.

Ride Rules:


- 1. Riders must obey all Illinois traffic laws.
- 2. Ride no more than two abreast.
- **3.** When riding in a large group, create space to help motorists.
- **4.** Use hand signals and obey all traffic signals.
- **5.** Check all intersections for traffic.
- **6.** Warn riders of potholes, dogs, cars, and other obstacles.
- **7.** Riders are strongly encouraged to wear approved helmets.
- **8.** Riders should make certain that their bikes are in good working condition.
- **9.** Riders should carry water and a spare tube for their wheel size.
- **10.** Riders should be prepared for weather conditions.

Most rides take place in any weather.

11. Riders should arrive in time to be <u>ready to ride</u> at the start time.
