
Now that the electronic edition is released, this list will serve as your reminder to renew.

MEET IN THE MIDDLE RIDE A HUGE SUCCESS. On October 1, almost 100 riders converged on the sleepy little village of Mackinaw, in what the League of Illinois Bicyclists, the Tri County Regional Planning Commission and the Illinois Dept. of Natural Resources billed as the Meet in the Middle Ride. Forty-four riders departed from Bloomington and 53 riders departed from the caboose at the Fondulac Dist. Office on the E. Peoria Trail end, and rode into Mackinaw on trails and back roads with fresh bike lane markings and bike lane signs along the way. Riders from E. Peoria were also treated to a brand new surface on the trail. The asphalt and roadbed were completely removed and refurbished all the way between E. Peoria and Morton.

In 2007, the League, TCRPC and the IDNR, introduced a vision of connecting the Rock Island Trail and the Route 66 trail in the Bloomington-Normal area. Eventually all of this will connect with the I & M Canal Trail by a series of off-road routes as well as low volume on-road routes. Riders from both ends met in Mackinaw and enjoyed lunch and a few announcements from those responsible for promoting this ride. Afterwards, officials from LIB convened a board meeting to discuss the event.

Although the temps were in the mid 40's to start, the sun was out bright with only a slight north breeze. A picture perfect day to introduce the fall riding season. A map and queue sheet are available on the LIB website.




Take time to thank the ride leaders for their dedication through out the season, for helping make the club what it has become known for. Great rides, great riders, good company and lots and lots of food.




