

ONE WICKED BIKER

The Stuart Dobbie Story

At 56, Stuart Dobbie is one wicked biker. He proves it when he grabs his mountain bike and ascends the hills at the ski resorts surrounding Lake Tahoe or at Jackson Hole. He proves it when he turns up the speed on his custom-built racing bike. And he proved it again this October when he asked Wheelm'n president Mike Honnold to direct him to some country roads during his three-week stint in Peoria.

Stuart Dobbie is also one" Wicked" biker. He was here to ensure that all of those sets that help make the high-flying Broadway show so engaging were put together right, that the scenery and the lighting appeared and disappeared at the right time, and that none of the above fell on the actors.

The sets are put together backstage, of course, but the rigging takes place from a grid 70 to 110 feet above stage. From there were hung 90-plus chain motors that picked up and moved 90,000 pounds of set pieces, scenery and lights at just the right time. "That's what's above the actors' heads every night," Dobbie says. During performances he served as "flyman," which means he was responsible for bringing in anything that comes from above – chandeliers, curtains, a big bridge. "Back in the old days, sailors used to do my job," having gotten their training climbing the masts on big ships.

Makes flying down Jackson Hole on a mountain bike look almost tame.

A carpenter and rigger by profession, Dobbie is a rock climber, hiker, camper, mountaineer and biker by hobby. While most of those associated with performances of "Wicked" fly to their next destination, he drives a van that holds his gear so he can enjoy "outdoor-type things." In Peoria that meant four or five bike rides on quiet roads that took him past pumpkin patches and cornfields but were quite flat, compared to the hills he loves to climb. Were the farmers friendly? "Actually the roads were pretty quiet," he says. "I didn't see many people."

He traveled routes Mike Honnold provided, having found the Illinois Valley Wheelm'n on the web and through a referral from a local bike shop. "I knew there were farm roads out there, but I had no idea how to find them," Dobbie said. "Mike was really nice. He sent me a lot of information with links to different things."

A serious biker for perhaps 15 years, Dobbie turned to the sport because he loves being outdoors and seeing natural areas that aren't easily accessible by car. He's had an opportunity to do a great deal of that while touring the country in support of such shows as Miss Saigon, Beauty and the Beast, The Producers and, of course, Wicked. This is his seventh year with Wicked, a show so popular that it enjoys long engagements (next is a nine-week run in Los Angeles) and is on the road 365 days a year. Monday is the crew's only day off.

Born in Scotland, Dobbie moved as a child to the United States, ending up in Old Orchard Beach, Maine, a tourist town with 5,000 residents in the winter and 150,000 in the summer, he says. He went to U.S. International University in San Diego as a hockey recruit with no particular academic program in mind. Trying to figure out what to do with the young man, a university official asked what *he* liked to do. "Lights and sound," he responded, reflecting upon his work for some musician friends. The official suggested he study technical theater, and "I said OK." It wasn't long before he left the

hockey team so he could concentrate on theater. And it wasn't much longer before he had so many offers to be a stage manager that he left school entirely to begin his career.

What's a stage manager do?

"He controls the whole show," Dobbie says. "He deals with the actors and gives the lighting and sound and carpenter cues – anything that happens on stage." He handles the actors' schedules, arranges rehearsals. Which may explain why after five years this stage manager found himself burned out and back home in Maine.

He spent a year volunteering with a theater company, building scenes and helping out during shows, and that "just kind of got the bug going again," as a carpenter this time around. He also got the travel bug and figured it would be better to get paid to see the country than pay to do it. So he applied for jobs with regional theaters, especially seeking out places he wanted to see – Tucson, Denver, California, Alaska. It was in Alaska that he got into rigging shows. More experience brought an offer from a major touring company.

On the road almost constantly, Dobbie has spent just four and a half months in the house he bought in Salt Lake City 30 months ago. It's not that he doesn't take time off, it's that he likes to spend his vacations traveling. In May he'll be gone nearly six weeks while climbing Mt. McKinley. They say it's a bit higher than the Civic Center's rafters.

As for Peoria, he says the theater was smaller than usual, but he's rigged smaller and tighter ones. What really bothered the crew, most of whom had no cars, was the lack of things to do downtown at night.

Wheelm'n who spend their days on a bike, and their nights sleeping the rides off, probably haven't noticed.




