



#### How the Wheelm'n Got Its Name

How did the Illinois Valley Wheelm'n get its name? The answer is both more and less complicated than you might think.

Keith Bransky, who was 14 at time time, credits his dad, Peoria surgeon Ralph Bransky. "Circa 1971 I rode with a group called the Tri-County Wheelers," Keith wrote in an e-mail to IVW President Mike Honnold. "After one of these rides, my father came to pick me (and my Schwinn Varsity 5-speed) up in the family station wagon. The post-ride discussion was changing the club name. My father suggested 'Illinois Valley Wheelmen' (after the League of American Wheelmen). The name got a nodding approval from the five or six of us standing there, and that's pretty much how the IVW name was adopted." Keith says the group that nodded approval included Joe Mugavero, Bob Keller, Les Siegrist, and Gene and Dixie Snyder.

The first printed evidence of that decision takes the form of a 1973 newsletter bearing the name and logo (reprinted here) that Keith attached to his e-mail. The newsletter also mentions another decision -- to charge club dues for the first time. Singles would pay two dollars and families three. Money from the dues would be used for such purchases as a bike trailer, club patches, a flashing light for the sag wagon and "a large water cooler." The newsletter refers to "an excellent rider from Grenoble, France" on a ride from Princeville to Toulon and says his address would be in IVW files.

All of this makes it clear that the club was founded before the 1974 date mentioned in "Routes & Recipes" – in 1971, assuming Keith's memory is correct – but sometime before that under a different name and likely with a less formal structure. It also creates another mystery: How did the "Wheelmen" become the "Wheelm'n"?

Here's what Sam Joslin, a former newsletter editor, says:

"As I recall, the club wasted at least one (very possibly more) good meeting debating the apostrophe, which was introduced in the attempt to remove gender bias from the name while still retaining a link to the Wheelmen name, which was still part of the League of American Wheelmen." Also discussed was changing the name to the Peoria Bicycle Club. Proponents argued that such a name would have historical significance, in that one of the first bike clubs in the nation was the Peoria Bicycle Club. It had been established in 1881 but was dormant a century later, when the discussion about a name change took place. (The Peoria Bicycle Club was revived in 1989.) Opponents argued that members from the suburbs would think they weren't represented by a club calling itself "Peoria" anything.

Does that solve the mystery?

Not entirely.

Ron Anderson's collection of old newsletters shows the "Wheelm'n" spelling first appearing in 1981 and used consistently throughout 1982. Then, says Ron, "Wheelmen" reappeared and "Wheelm'n" disappeared until May of 1989.

As for the Branskys, Ralph lives now in Santa Fe, N. Mex. Keith lives in Peachtree City, Ga., a planned community with 98 miles of paved bike paths and rides regularly on them. But he spends more time on a higher-tech mode of transportation – as captain of a Boeing 777 for Delta Air Lines.


