A note from your president

Happy March everyone. Can you believe this weather, and it is only March! I know the season hasn't really started yet, but I am looking forward to my summer bike trip in Ohio.

It is called GOBA. It stands for Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure. A family my dad and I met on across Illinois back roads in 2001 introduced me to it. We signed up in 2002 and I have been doing it ever since.

GOBA moves around Ohio every year. The nice thing about it rotating every year is anyone can come and ride. They alternate the routes to be hilly one year and mild to flat the next year.

When I started GOBA there were around 3000 riders for the week. It has shrunk a little over the years but still has over 2000. It is a family-focused ride that is 7 days. One cool option is something called car camping. If you have little kids/grand kids or maybe a family member who doesn't like to ride or would like to ride shorter distances than this might interest you. Basically you can take your car to each town instead of leaving it at the start site.

Another cool thing is that they have layover days throughout the week and options for those who want to ride everyday as well. I always do the century optional day and occasionally take the other day off. If you do the century you get a patch or a pin to commemorate your accomplishment. Last year we stayed in Oxford and I decided to explore campus (Miami University) and go swimming.

This year the ride starts in Findlay. Every year there is a theme for the week. This year it is "there's no place like GOBA". On Saturday they have a parade and a contest. It will be cool to see how many riders dress up as Dorothy and have Toto with them.

Some might wonder how many miles GOBA is. Each day is around 40-60 miles except for the layover days. This is perfect for newer riders as well as young and old. It is not a race so you can take your time as long as you don't miss the truck in the morning. They transport your gear from town to town for you. If you happen to get there first you may have to empty the trucks.

When is GOBA you ask? It always starts Father's Day weekend. This year it is June 17-24. Some years it has been hotter than blue blazes. Other years it is cold at night. One other risk is rain. Last year we had an unusual experience. A tornado came through early in the morning. I had never experienced sirens and an evacuation before. The staff on the ride was great and no problems occurred, except for a trip to the Laundromat and some duct tape to fix my rain fly.

My favorite part of GOBA is all the new friendships I have made. The first year I only knew the family that invited us to come. By the end of the week I had met many kids and people from all over the US and even Canada. We now have a crew of about 8 that tries to meet up every year. Great-grandmother cycled all throughout Europe

At 78 year old, Ethel MacDonald has cycled most of Western Europe in the short span of 13 years. The great-grandmother has covered over 10,000 miles overseas since 2003, the first year she took up bicycle touring. Some of the countries she had toured include Sweden, Ireland, France and Spain. When asked which countries she think offers the best cycling experience, she ranked Holland at the top of the list followed by Denmark and Germany.

"Holland and Denmark are both just made for cyclists and Germany, there it's so good and drivers are so aware of cyclists and so polite."

Despite her age, Ethel keeps up with the modern age when she is touring with her dog by utilizing online travel communities <u>Warm Showers</u> and <u>Couchsurfing</u> to find a place to stay and hosts guests herself when she is home in Missoula. Warm Showers is exclusively for touring cyclists while Couchsurfing is for any travelers wanting to meet new people or open their homes to others.





Ethel started biking when she was 41 back in 1979. It was her main mode of transportation after her divorce. When she relocated to Missoula, Montana, biking around town really made sense since her home was (and it still is) centralize in Missoula. Besides the obvious reasons for riding whenever she can – fitness, enjoyment, she rides because it's the right thing to do for the planet, the community and for the thing she believes in ardently: world peace.

"I really see energy conservation being linked to my peace activities and I find it ironic that people who are linked to peace and to sustainability issues don't practice energy conversation," she said. "It's part of my overall ethic to not use oil. We go to war for oil and kill each other for oil. I try to use as little oil as possible." Closer to home MacDonald helps to broker peace between Missoula cyclists and motorists by getting involve with local politics that affects cycling. She considers herself something of a two-wheeled ambassador. Ethel also advocate that cyclists need to help everyone be safer by wearing reflective clothing with lights on the back and front of bikes when they are riding. In addition, he is a certified bike safety instructor in Illinois thru League of American Bicyclists as well as a certified spin class instructor. Prior to getting involved in the bicycle industry, Keen also raced competitively for 10 years at the amateur level out of Western Springs near the Chicago Area. He had raced Road, Crit and Cyclo-cross against some of the state's top riders like Robbie Ventura, Chris Horner, Tom Doughty to name a few.
