The group picked up additional participants from Junction City Shopping Center in Peoria Heights, Levee Shopping Districts in E. Peoria and Morton Trailhead on Jefferson St. The ride was to celebrate the opening of the Mackinaw Valley Trail back on October 1st 2011. IVW member Tim O'Hanlon and a group of local bike enthusiasts contacted the Illinois Department of Natural Resources 9 years ago about creating the Mackinaw Valley Trail. It would offer a safe route for tourists to ride from Peoria to Bloomington-Normal and vice-versa. Out of the Box Tour #11: Barb's Birthday Ride

Barb's birthday ride along the Great River Trail paralleling the Mississippi is a tradition for the Out of the Box Tour. It is about as pretty as it gets in Illinois, and the birthday cake will be good too. This is Barb's favorite ride in Illinois, and she's glad she's not too old YET to share it with you. We'll do the southerly route again, because it's the prettiest, and we'll follow up with our lunch and birthday cake tradition at the Brothers Family Restaurant in Rapids City. That's about 30 miles, but you can turn north and go more or turn around and go less, depending on how fast you ride on your way back for lunch at 1pm. If you want to see the Quad Cites, you can join Fai M. for a metric century along the trails on the Iowa side. Plan to leave from the riverfront parking lot at 8:00am. Do bring the family; slower riders can enjoy the spectacular scenery just as much as faster ones, and there are some nice parks to explore along the way. The entire trail is paved. The ride begins at 9:15am at the riverfront parking lot in Rapids City. (*Take Rt. 84 exit north from Rt. 80. Go a half-mile or so, looking for gas station on your right and then turning left onto 18th Street. Turn right at the river, and go 4 or 5 blocks to the lot.*) Let Barb (692-1201, bdrake110744@gmail.com) know if you plan to show up for a ride. That way she can let you know if weather requires cancellation or a change in start-up time – or if road construction forces a change of plans.

For someone who had never ridden in Wisconsin until last year, I have become a regular visitor in the Land of the Cheese, doubling from 2 trips last year to 4 trips this year. The most recent adventure was the Fall Peninsula Challenge at Sister Bay on the Door Peninsula. I did this tour last year and really loved the scenery AND the food after the ride. Hence, I went back several weeks ago. The weather was ideal with temperature in the low 60s in the morning and warmed up to mid7-70s by afternoon with a 10mph lake breeze. During the tour, I met a guy named Josh as I was taking on second King Of the Hill Strava segment challenge. We struck up a conversation since he is a Badger fan and I am a Spartan fan. We met up a few more times at different rest stops along with his two cycling companions, both from the suburbs of Chicago. As we approached the third and final KOM segment challenge, I noticed he was struggling. After I completed the segment challenge, I decided to wait for him at the top after seeing his two companions but with him nowhere in sight.

Josh finally made it to the top as he was surprised to see me waiting. Little did I know this century ride was his longest ride of the year. He had only rode six spin class prior to it. I told him I would pull him the last 10 or so miles by blocking the wind for him. As he began to fade, I urged him to push beyond the fatigue and burn in the legs. We were able to finish strong as we were fueled by the vision of food and beer waiting for us. While we had our post ride meal, I learned both of Josh's friends, Marty and Lori also rode their longest ride, ever! I told all three that was quite a cycling achievement. We wound up hanging out at a sports bar later on. They really made my day as much as I made theirs. It is always an adventure when I go on these trips as you never know whom you will meet. – Fai Mok


