League of American Wheelmen This group is a national organization of bicyclists. It is composed of individuals and affiliated local clubs (IVV is one) who seek to promote bicycling. The LAW has a number of committees which strive to improve some aspect of cycling. E.G. - Legislative, touring, membership, educational, etc.

Bikecentennial is a national organization which began during the Bicentennial of the U.S. It started out by mapping and signing a cross-country bike route from Oregon to Villiansburg Va. Since then it has expanded by rapping other routes throughout the U.S. At present it is researching a Great River Route Along the Mississippi River. Bikecentennial also sponsors group tours along these routes.
